


CLASSES

Students learn the basics of golf. Learning the importance of stance, follow through and aiming with Coach Trevor.








Coach Larry emphasizes the importance of stretching before you start drills. He also teaches the students the basics of volleyball.








Students in the Mad Crafters class make DIY calendars for the new year. They also create flower lollipops for Washington MS teachers and staff to show their appreciation.









Students made thank you signs and wrote thank you cards for Foodland grocery store workers for our LSA project.










In STEM class, students learned the different animal species and to make it more fun, Coach Trevor had them include "Pokemon" animals, as well. Students had to present what they found.






STAFF TRAININGS
