Mixed Sports Class students enjoyed football and sports conditioning in preparation for the return to competitive flag football.

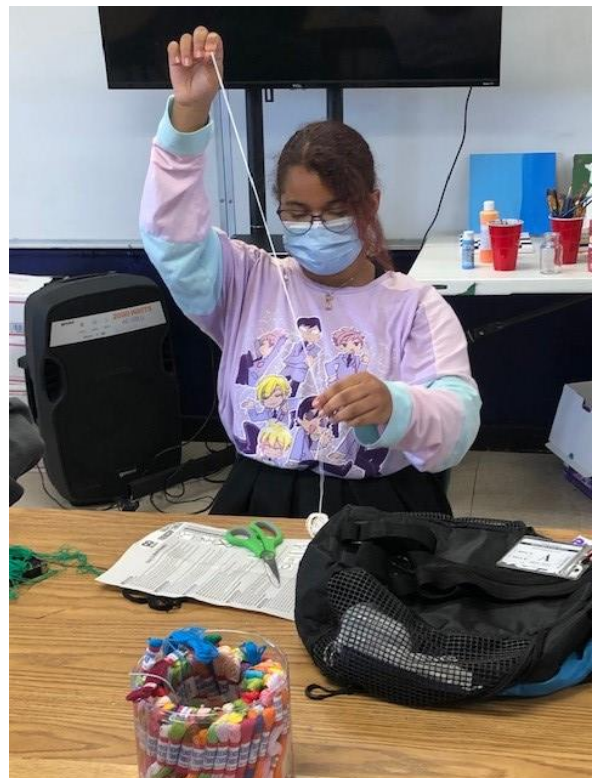


Cooking Class students completed awesome meals throughout the month of April.

Art Class students worked on a variety of creative ideas in April. Students enjoyed fashion design, acrylic painting, tribal drawing and friendship bracelets.

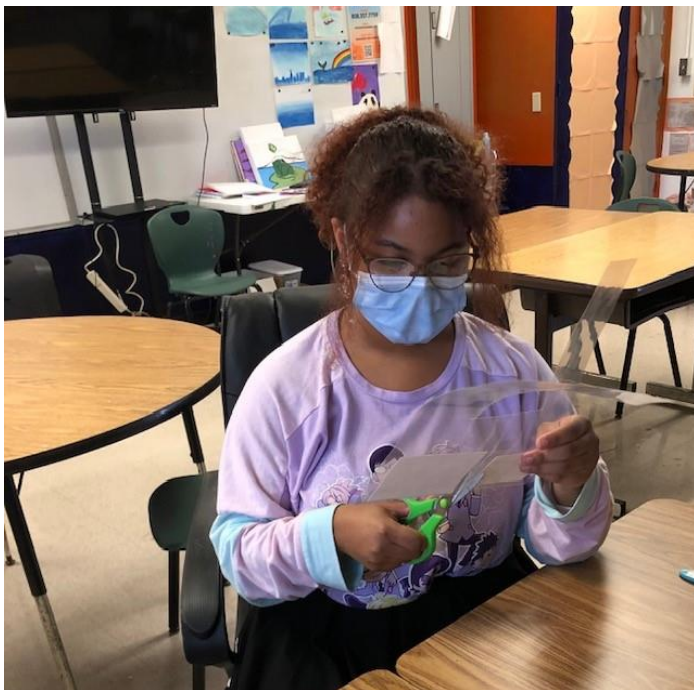




April brought spring showers, however *Basketball Conditioning Class* students were still able to practice a variety of skills including the fundamentals of layups, dribbling, and shooting.



Mixed Media Class students created some fun and cute stickers to decorate everything from water bottles to books using a Cricut digital art machine.



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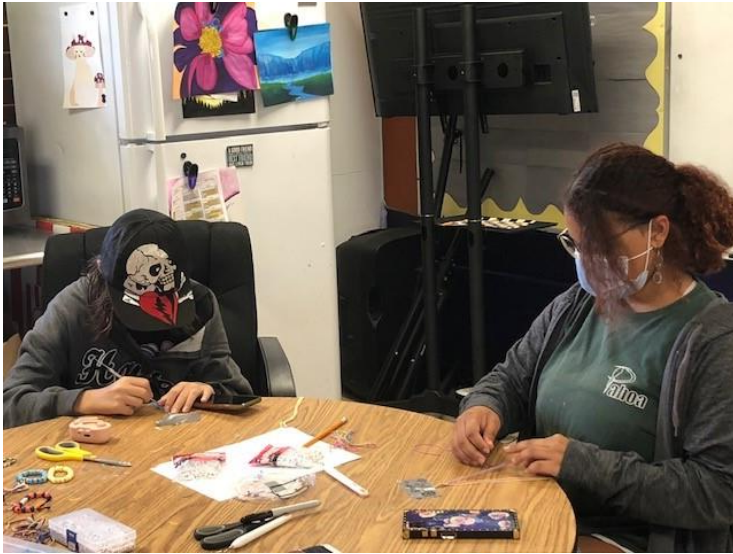
Volleyball Class Students finally get to enjoy the nice weather and play some friendly, but competitive, scrimmages.

A student works on a flyer to help Pahoa ASAS display the *Hawaiian Value of the Week; Me'e*.



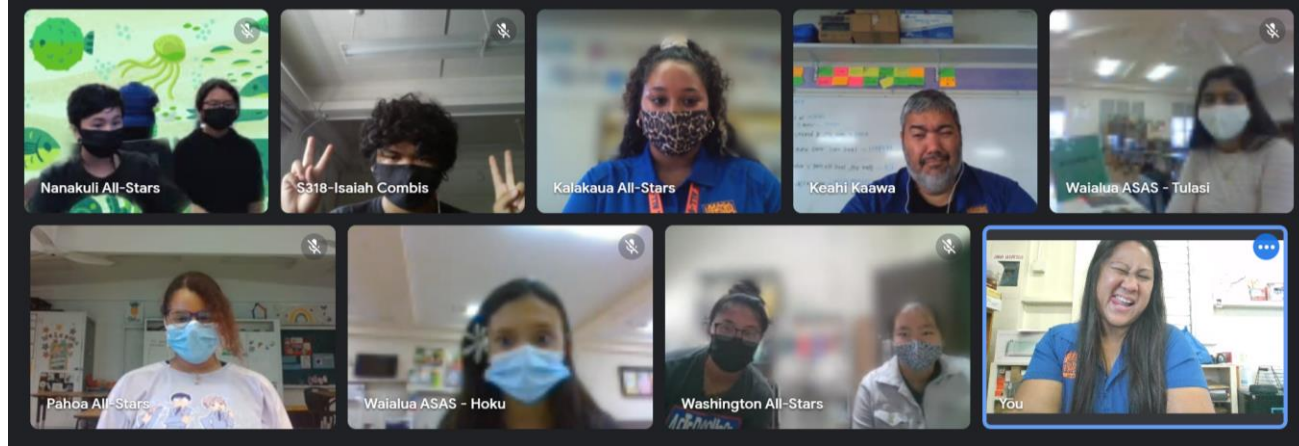
A group of students work together on a project for the C.E.O. curriculum. CEO provides students with information on careers, education, entrepreneurship, and ingenuity.
