Our last day of summer program was filled with lots of fun and water. Students played four corners, red light/green light and other fun games



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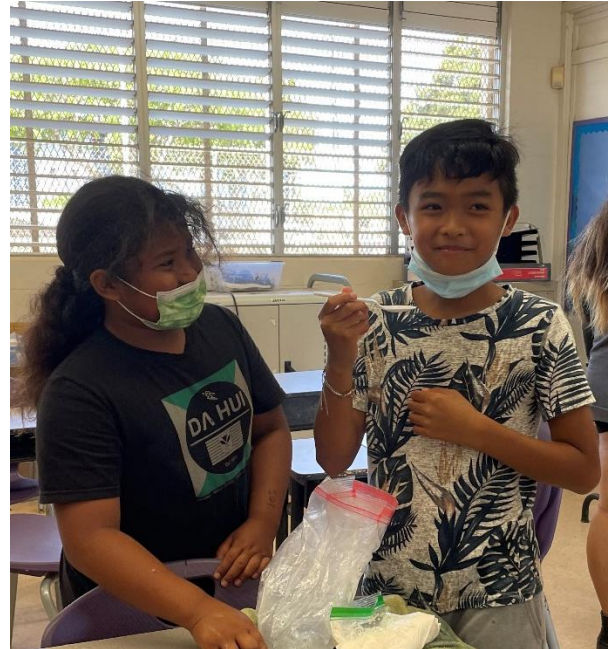
As a special treat, students got to soak all the ASAS staff before they formed a trash line to ensure they left the campus as clean as it was before they started.



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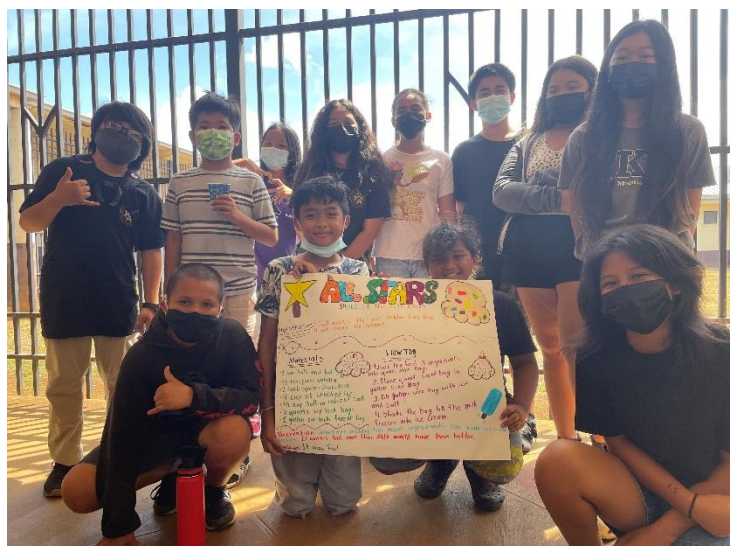
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STEM
