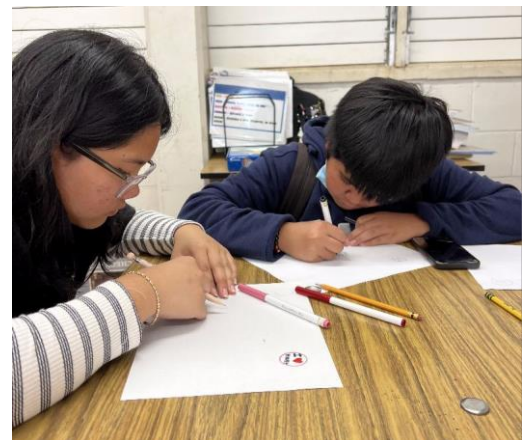


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In Arts and Crafts, our Program Leaders got together to figure out how to work our button machine. In the end all the students couldn't stop making these cute custom buttons.

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In Multi-sports, the students learned all sorts of different sports. Although not all knew how to play the sport, everyone had fun learning. Every student is willing to pick up something new to try.



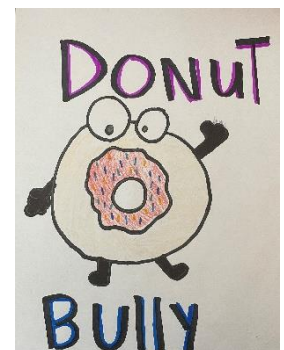
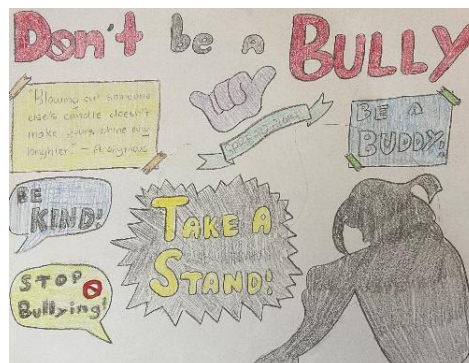
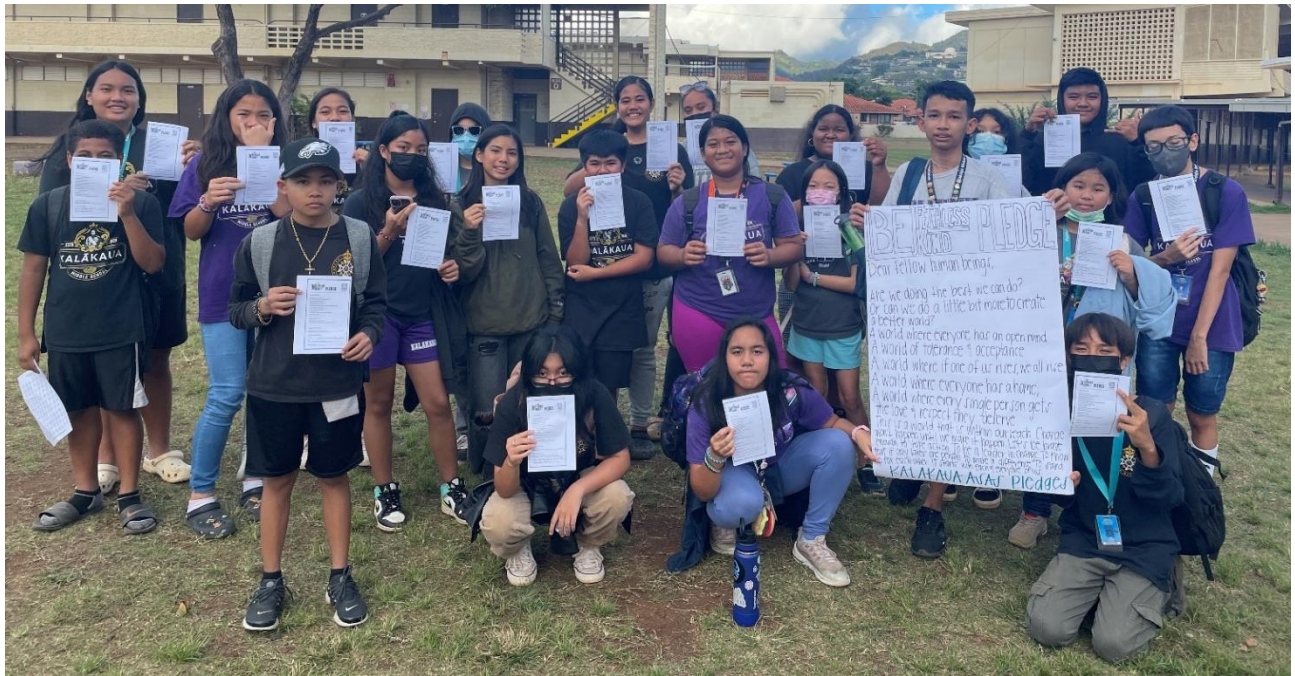
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SERVICE LEARNING PROJECT – LIFE SERVICE ACTION

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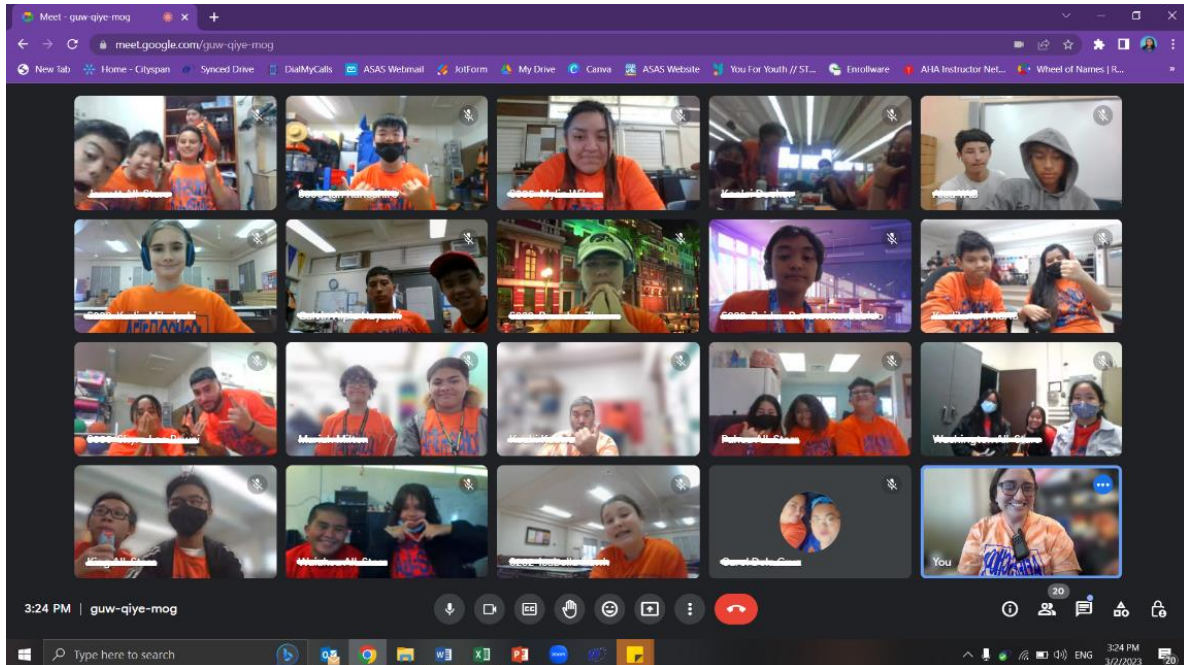

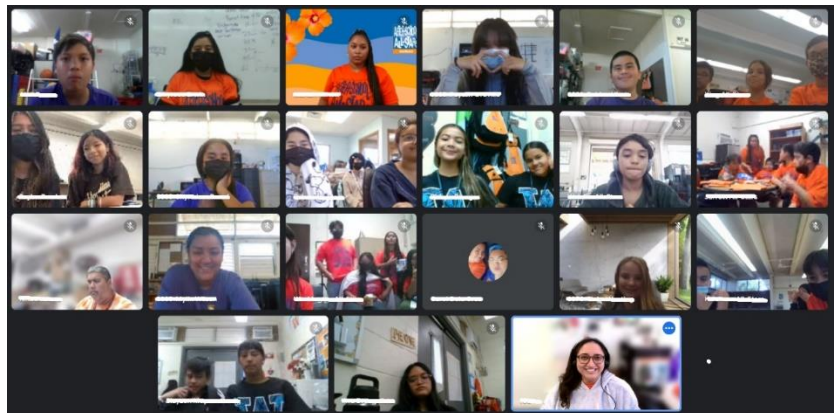
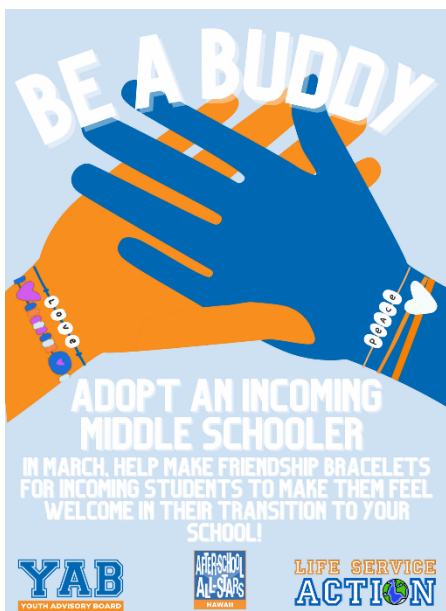
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YOUTH ADVISORY BOARD
