They made chicken potpie and cheesy pasta. And to celebrate Mardi Gras, they made their own King Cake!



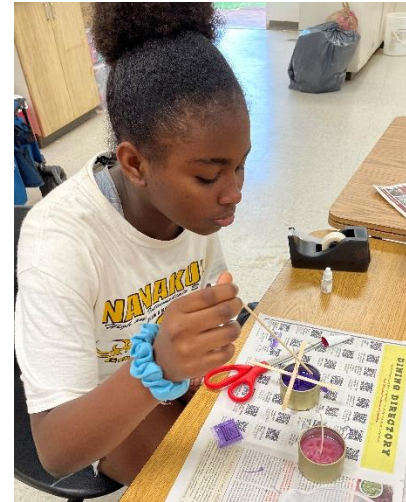


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### CLASSES

*Esports* has been practicing hard and getting ready for their upcoming competitions.





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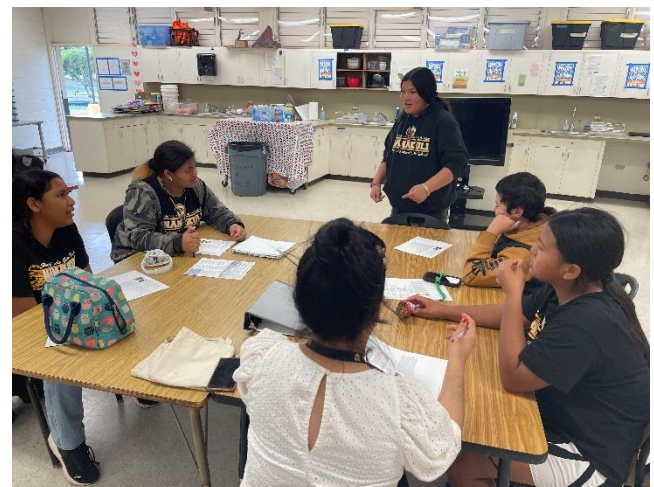
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### CLASSES

Our students also had the amazing opportunity to go to UH Manoa to watch a basketball game. Students were able to get some merch, eat some yummy food and watch their home team win.

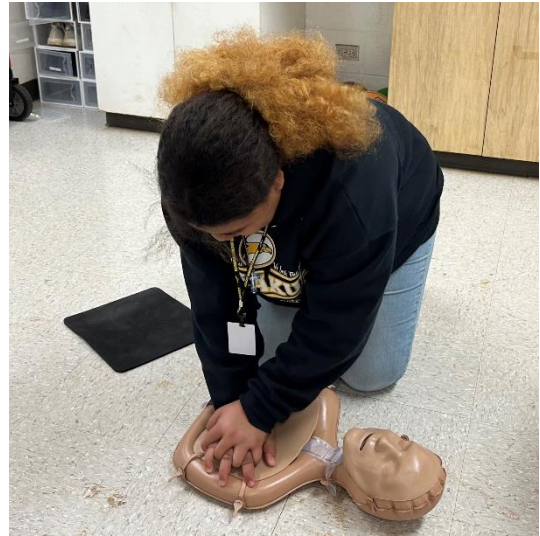

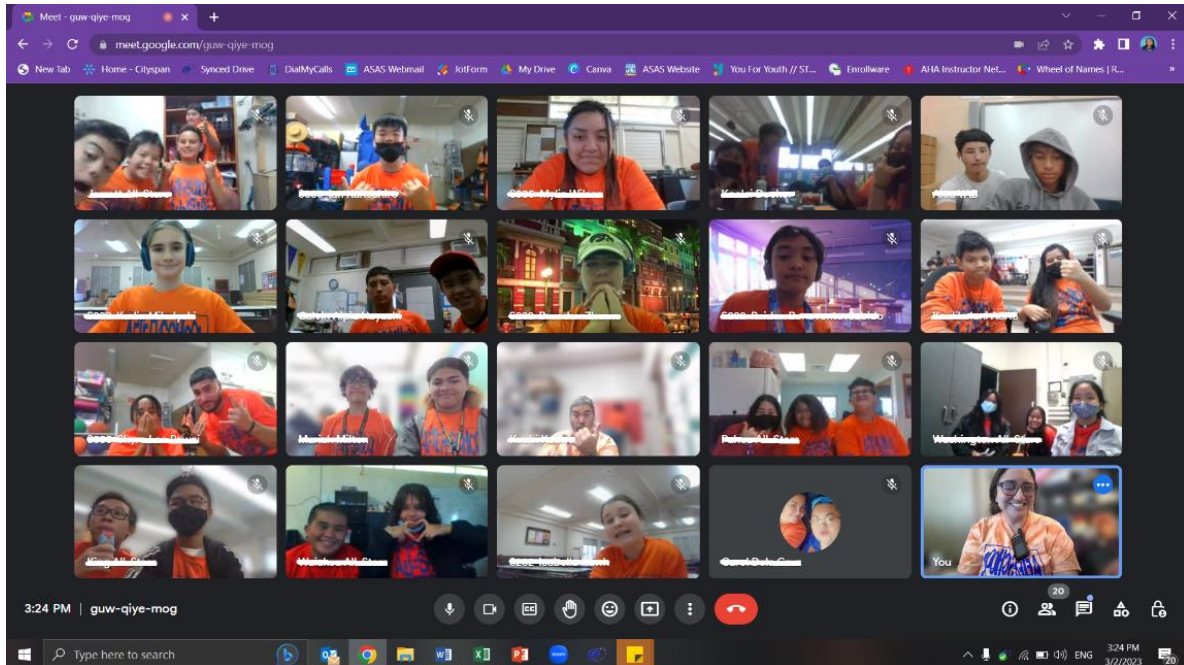




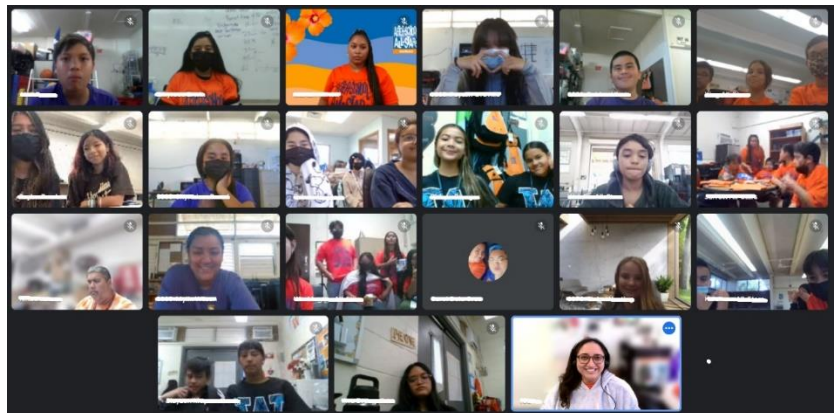
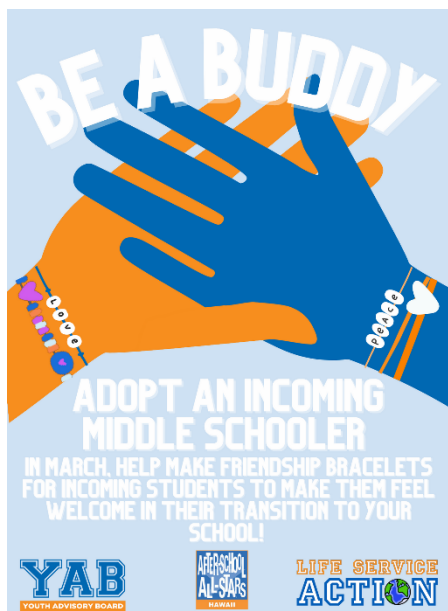
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#### YOUTH ADVISORY BOARD
