And to celebrate Mardi Gras, they made their own King Cake!


















HAWAIIAN VALUE OF THE WEEK

Our students also had the amazing opportunity to go to UH Manoa to watch a basketball game. Students were able to get some merch, eat some yummy food and watch their home team win.


