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DIY Project students made super awesome tie dye shirts in February. Students were able to wear the shirt for the PHIS spirit week tie dye day.

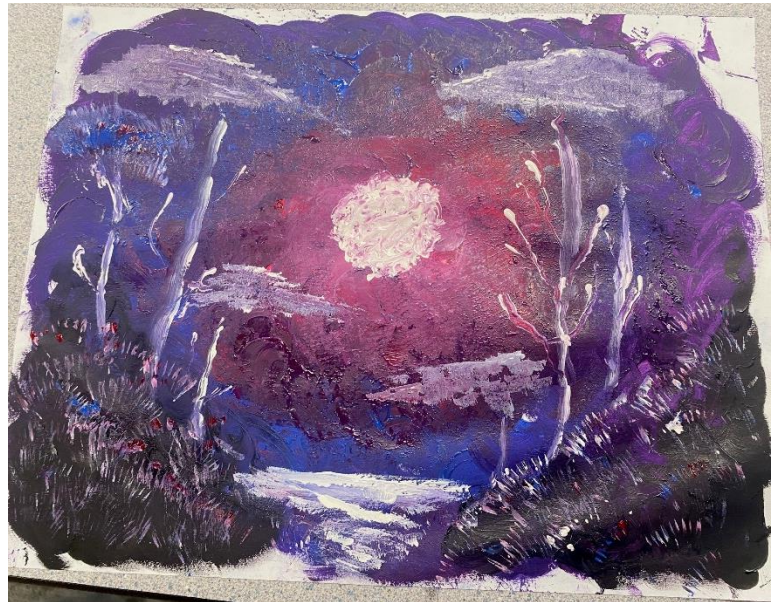


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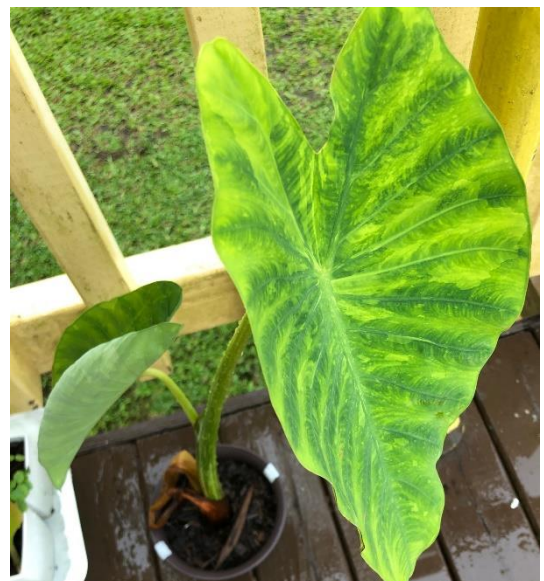

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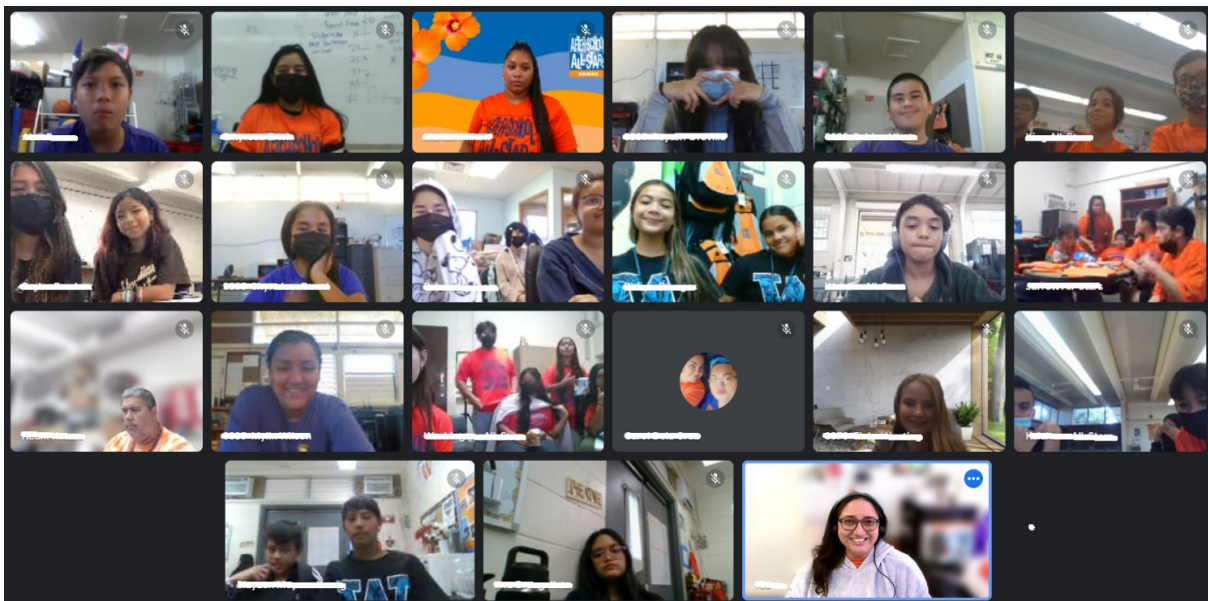
FIELD TRIPS
