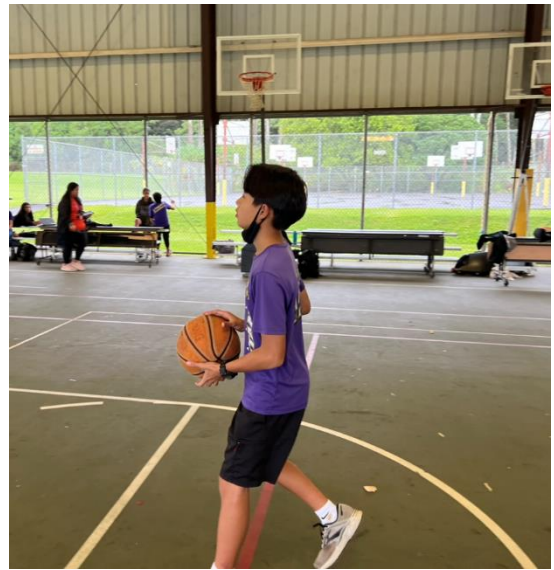
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Students in *Basketball Games* class have been perfecting their shot by challenging each other daily during knockout or gotcha games.

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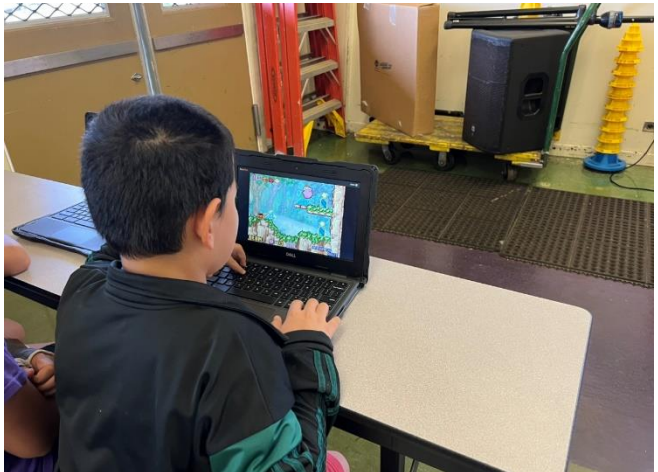

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FIELD TRIPS



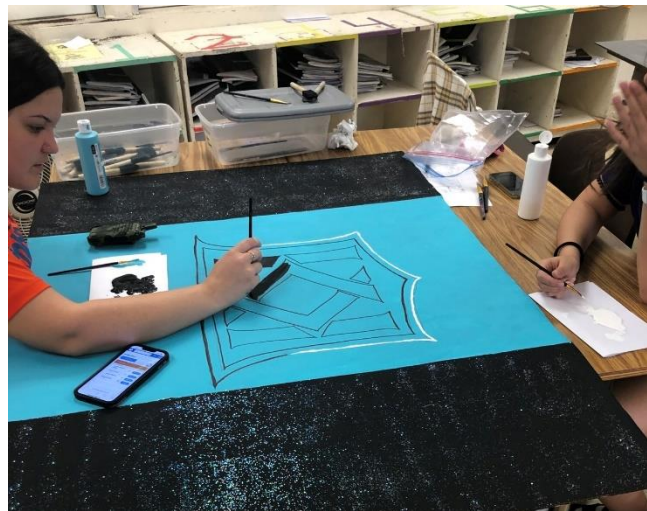

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SPECIAL EVENTS/CURRICULUM



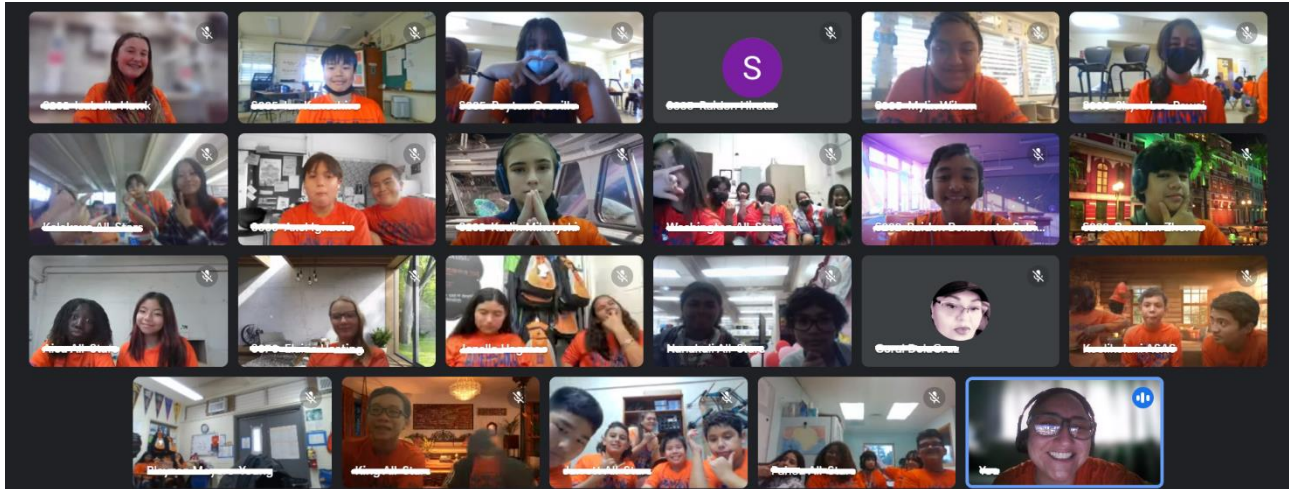
Students finish up their presentation boards for the *VentureLab CEO* final project. Students have been working hard towards creating their business, logo and slogans to present at our Q3 Hoike.



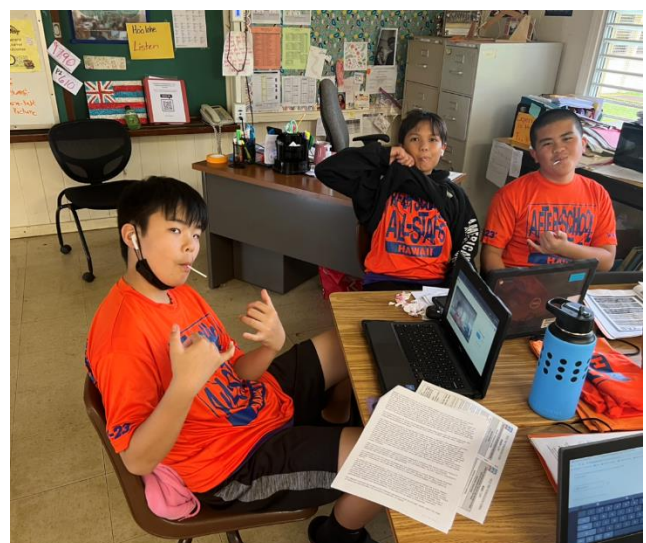

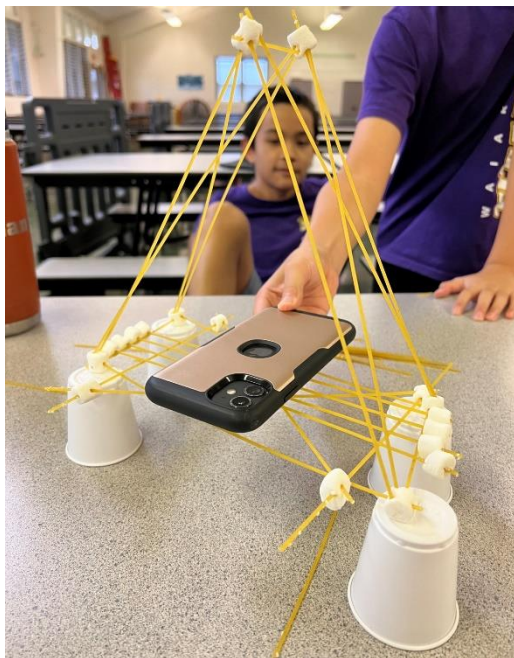
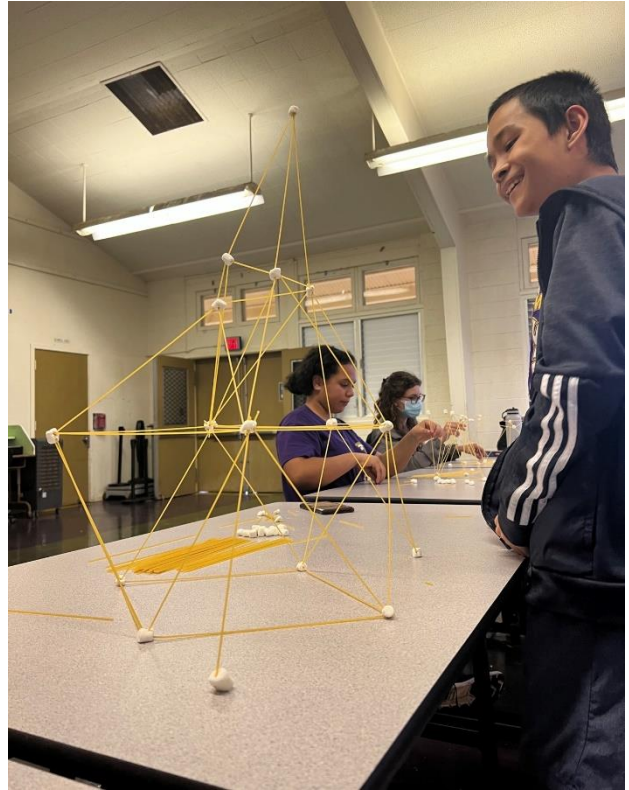
