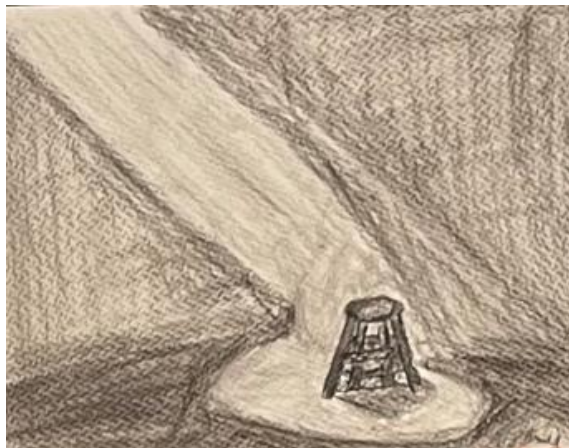
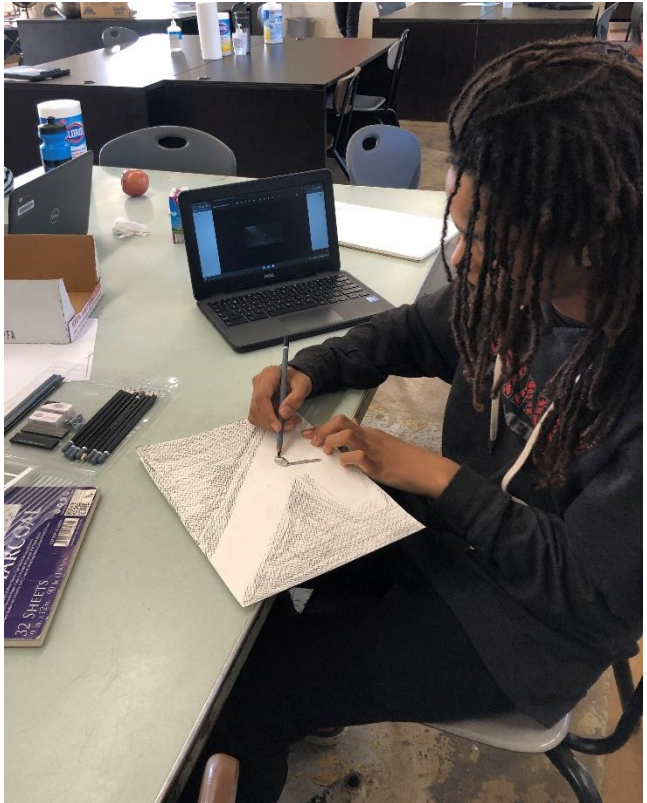
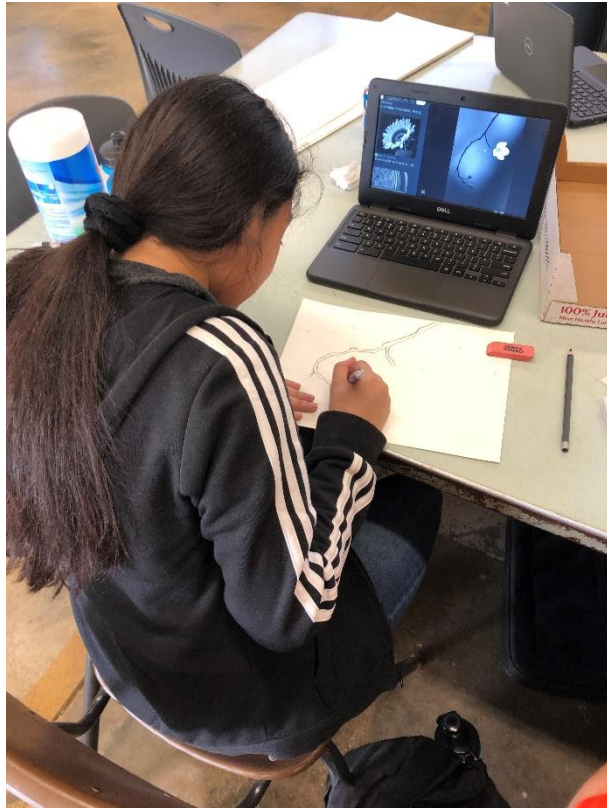
Homemade donuts taste even better when you enjoy them with our Cooking Class! Most of our athletes joined after a long day of school and practices.

The incoming 7th graders gathered in the gym with their families to go over registration and learn more about their classes. We are so excited to have these new students join us at ASAS.

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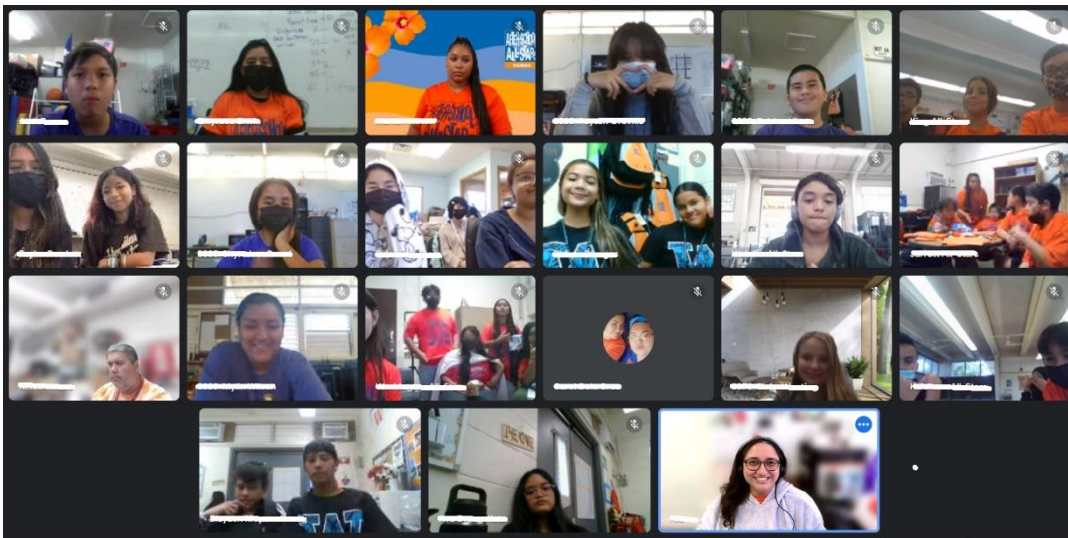
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SPECIAL EVENTS/CURRICULUM
