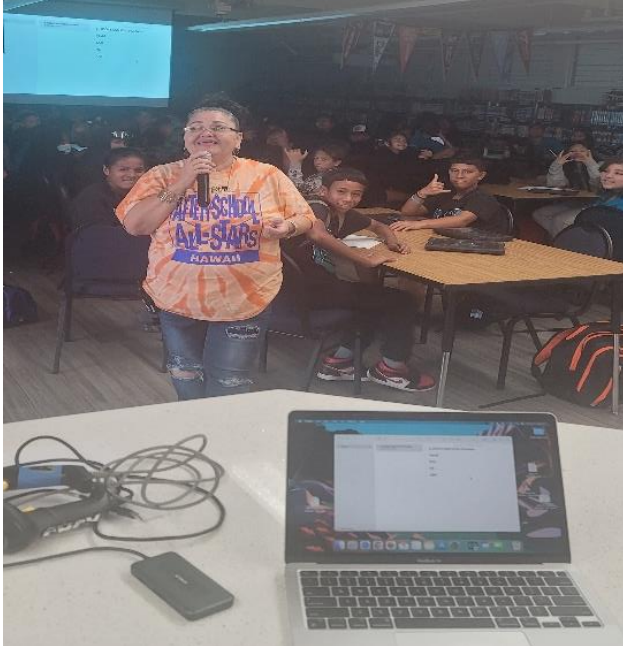




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#### SERVICE LEARNING PROJECT – LIFE SERVICE ACTION

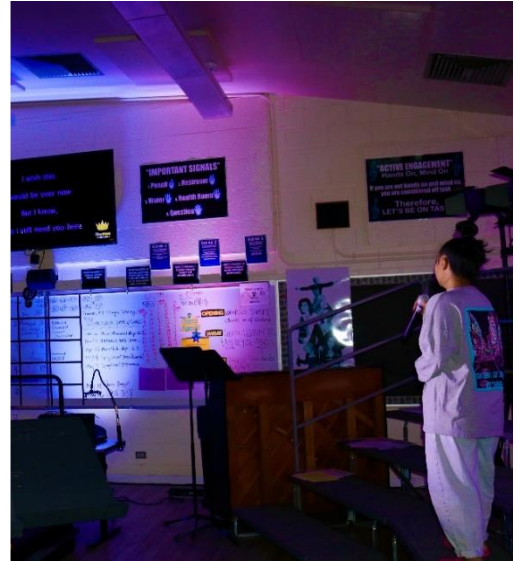

Scott Mann of VentureLabs provides ASAS staff with innovative ideas and structured curriculum to help guide students through the Career Exploration (CEO) class

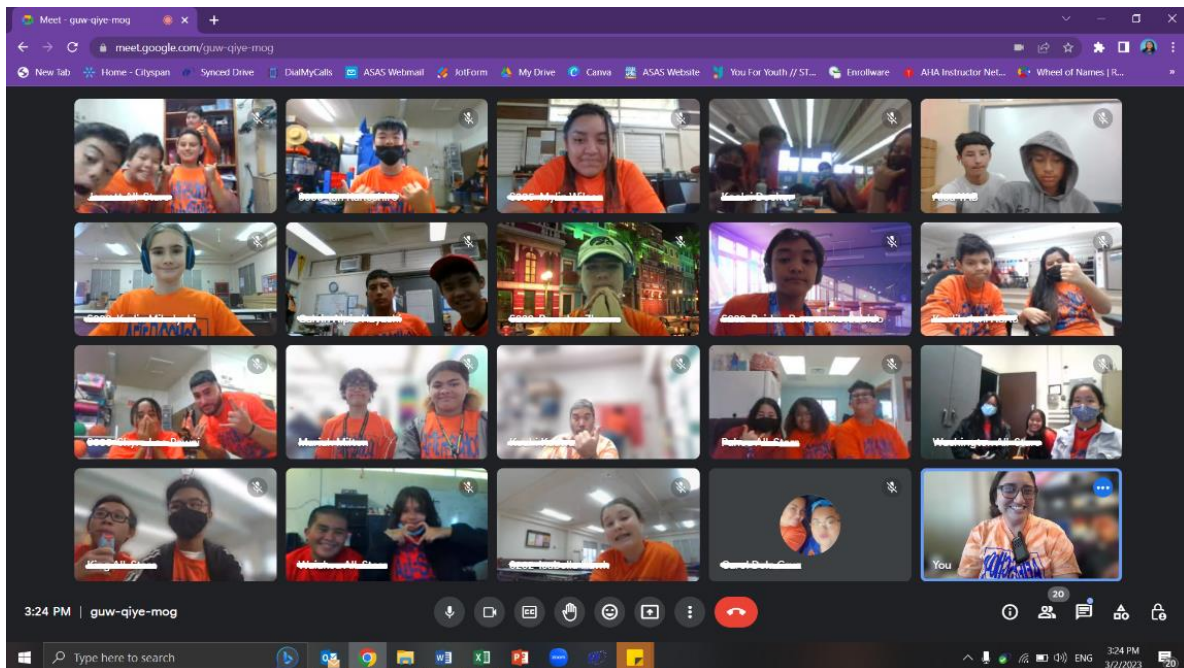




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#### YOUTH ADVISORY BOARD
