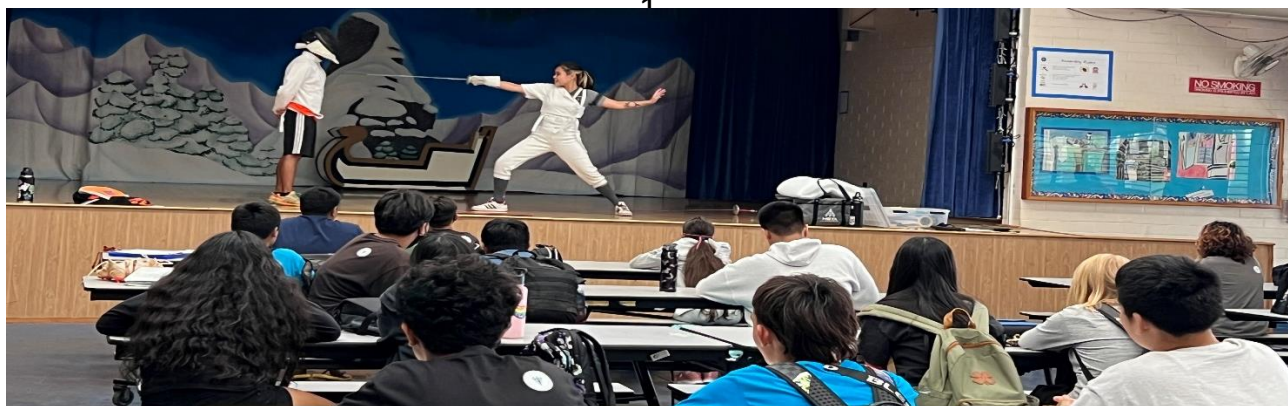


Students in musical are very supportive of each other. They have been working on student critiques. Giving each other supportive and constructive criticism gives them a voice and builds team work.

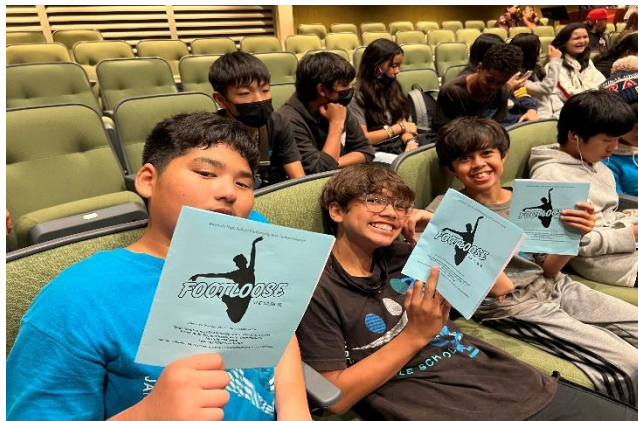
FIELD TRIPS

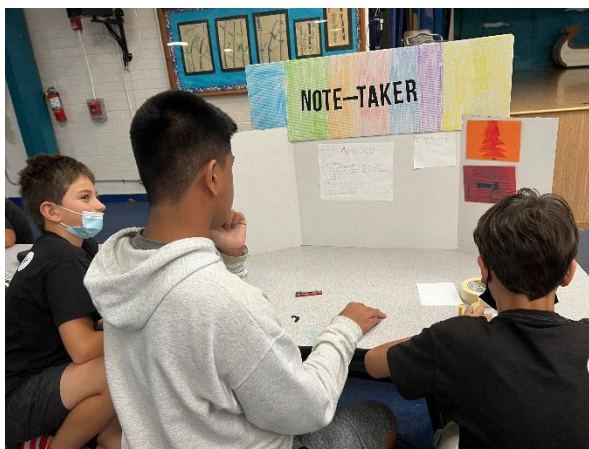
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SPECIAL EVENTS/CURRICULUM

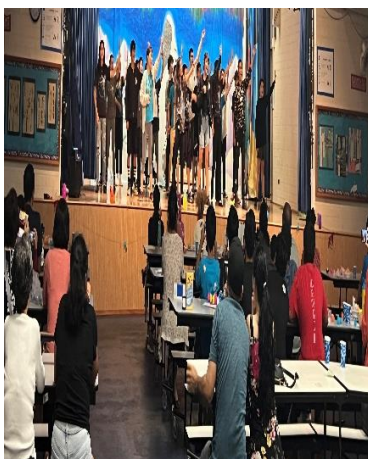
All-Stars and their families at Hoike took part in a blind folded Easter egg hunt, hung out with friend and ate some yummy food made by the cooking class.

At Ho'ike, students watched a musical slideshow and were entertained by the All-Stars students from Mana Mele, Hip-hop and Musical classes.



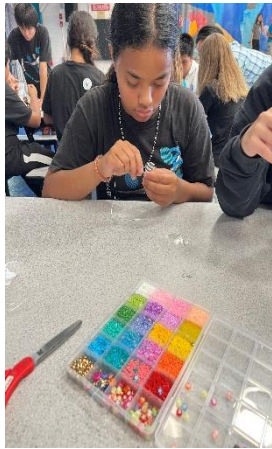
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SERVICE LEARNING PROJECT – LIFE SERVICE ACTION



For the month of march, Kulia All-Stars banded together to make friendship bracelets for the incoming 6th graders. The students are always happy and willing to give back to others.

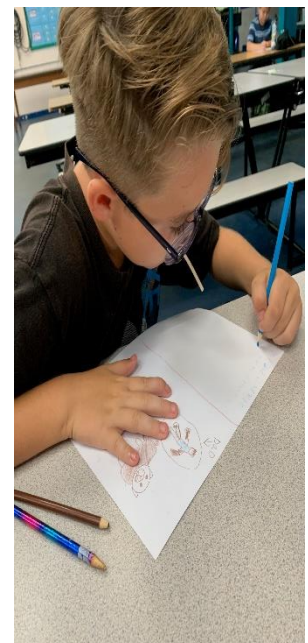
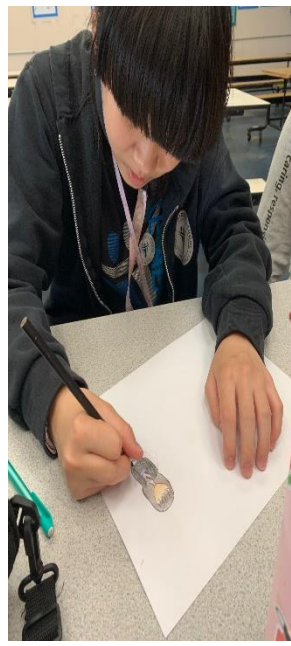


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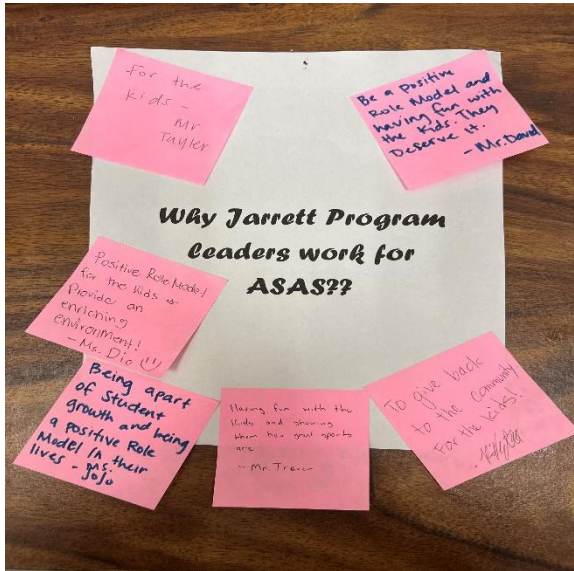
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STEM

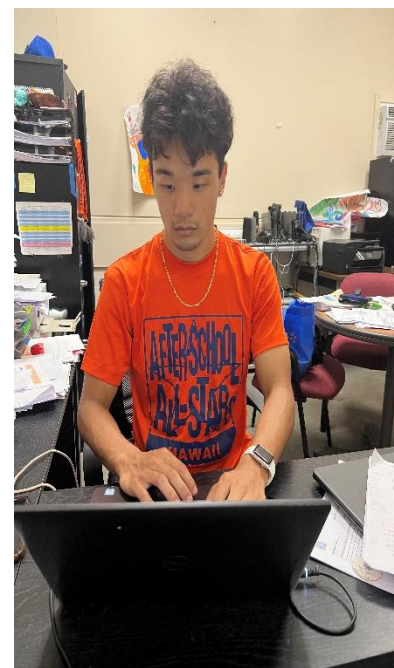

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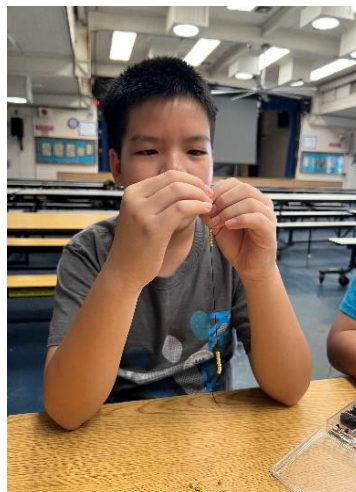
