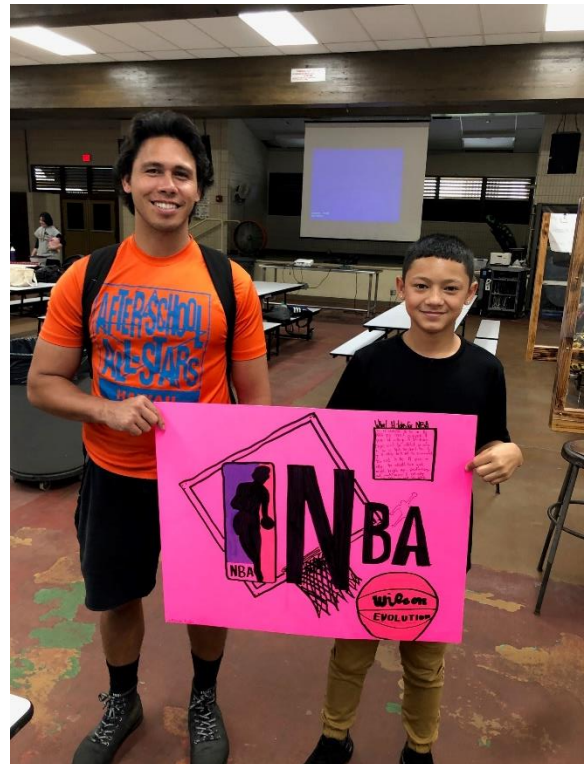


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*CEO, Career Exploration, students show off posters they made for the final project. The final project was a mock job fair that included some of their favorite careers they researched.*

This highlight; students are enjoying how to weave and make hats out of coconut palm fronds. Students also learned gardening skills, art skills and cooking skills in the weekly sessions.



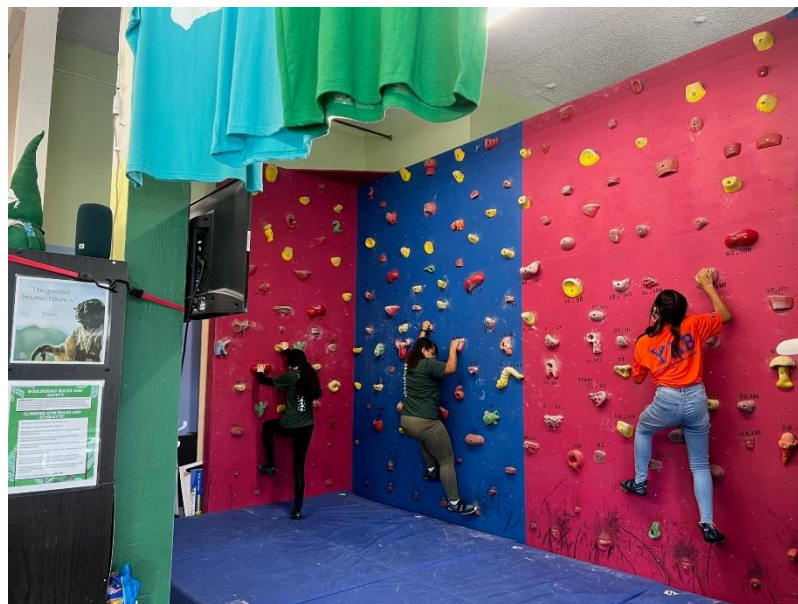


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#### FIELD TRIPS

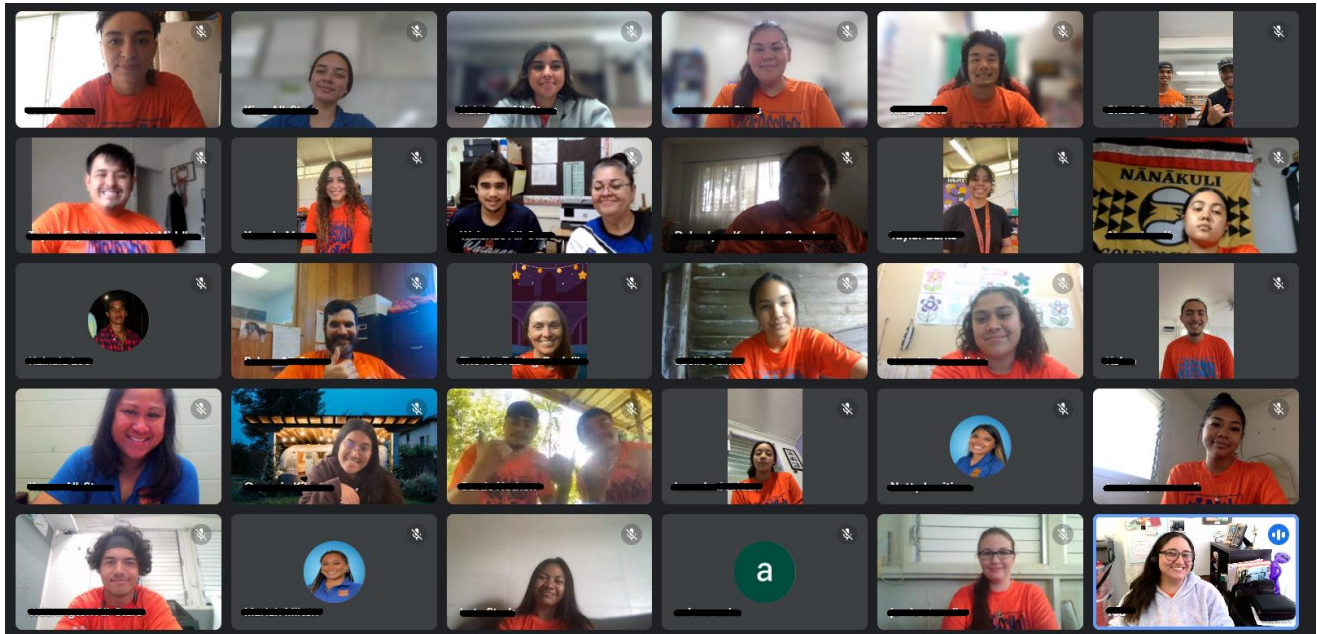




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#### STAFF TRAININGS
