

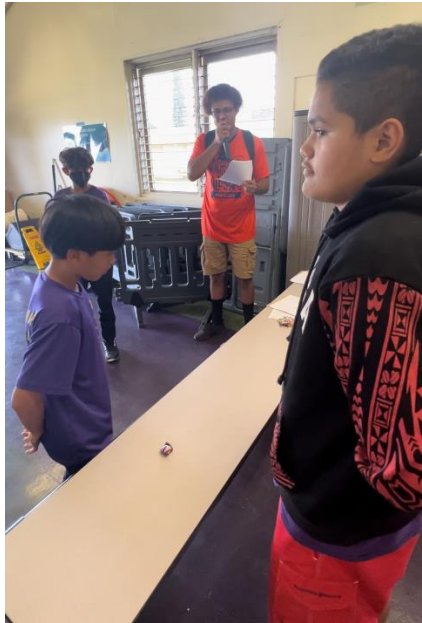

### CLASSES



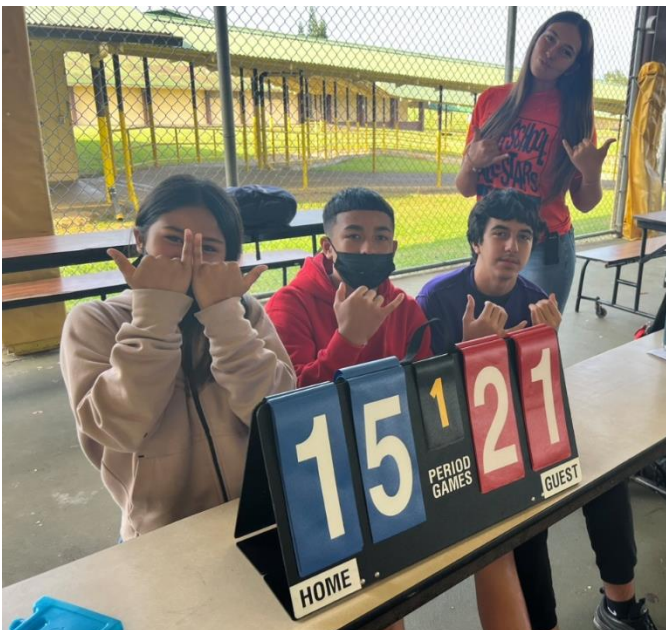

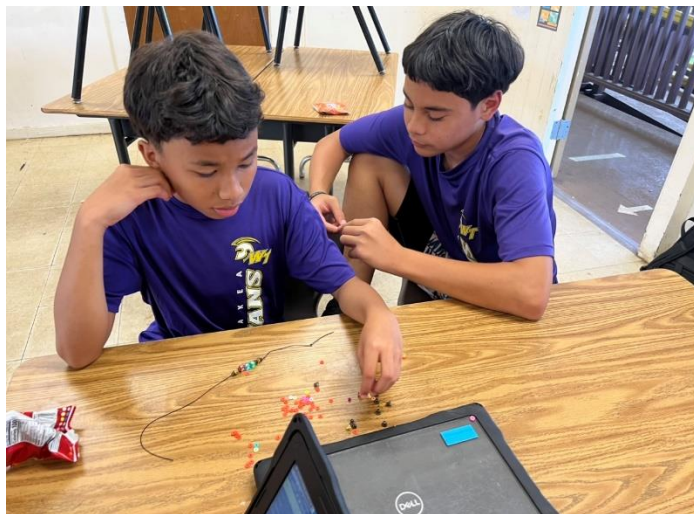
# MARCH 2023
