Archery Class got to break in some new targets and frames.



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
Basketball Class continues to hone skills and engage in fun competition.



Dance Hall gets the students moving and grooving.




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Merch Masters are practicing their craft as they sketch out their ideas.






Ultimate Gamers are warming up their fingers as they break in our new game consoles.




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Multi-Sport lets students play some old favorites, like kickball, and stay active.






For the fourth quarter in a row, volleyball remains a student favorite and the students are showing off their skills.

Anime Club learns Japanese in conjunction with enjoying the animated art of anime.








Students from our CEO class had the opportunity to present their careers at our reverse career fair during our quarter 3 Ho`ike. They did a great job!

Our 8th Grade students started their We Are Ready curriculum to provide them with valuable skills as they prepare to transition to high school.




All-Stars offers a variety of art related classes, and this quarter is no different. We have started an origami class and students are loving the skills they are learning.

Staff came together over Spring Break to get ready for the new quarter and discuss ways to make program even better for the students.


