Esports is not just about having fun, but more about learning critical thinking, problem solving, communication and sportsmanship. Students continue to compete with one another on their favorite games.



In Softball students have been practicing daily to get ready for their upcoming games. Students learned their positions and practiced their batting.








HAWAIIAN VALUE OF THE WEEK


