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Basketball Class students are shown during fun shooting and rebounding drills. Pahoa students love basketball and are preparing for next year's ASAL games.





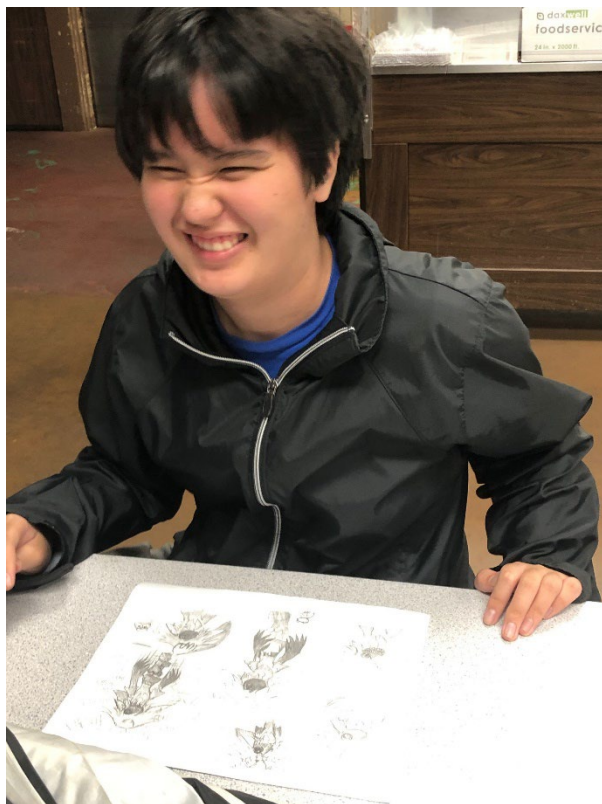
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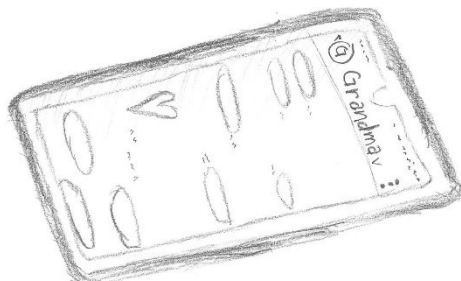
Football Class students practiced running receiver routes, corner back drills and put in some good conditioning during April. The students are looking forward to next year's ASAL Pylon Flag Football League.



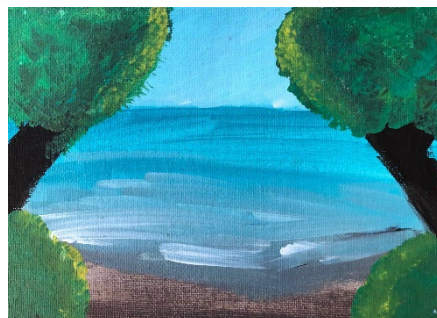
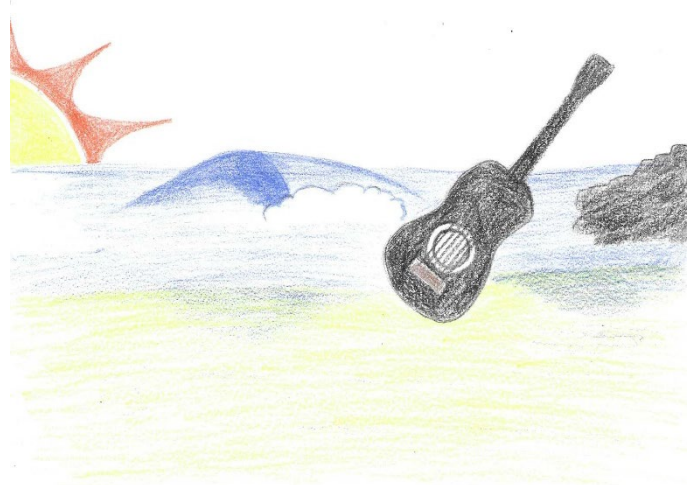

Softball Class had a blast participating in the ASAL Softball Saturday games at Waiakea Intermediate School. Go Daggers!

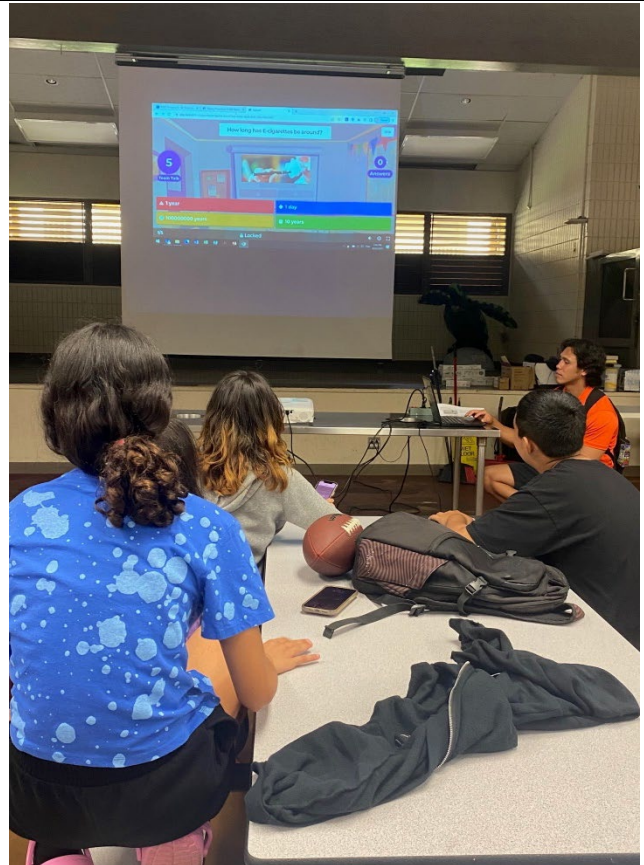


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SPECIAL EVENTS/CURRICULUM
