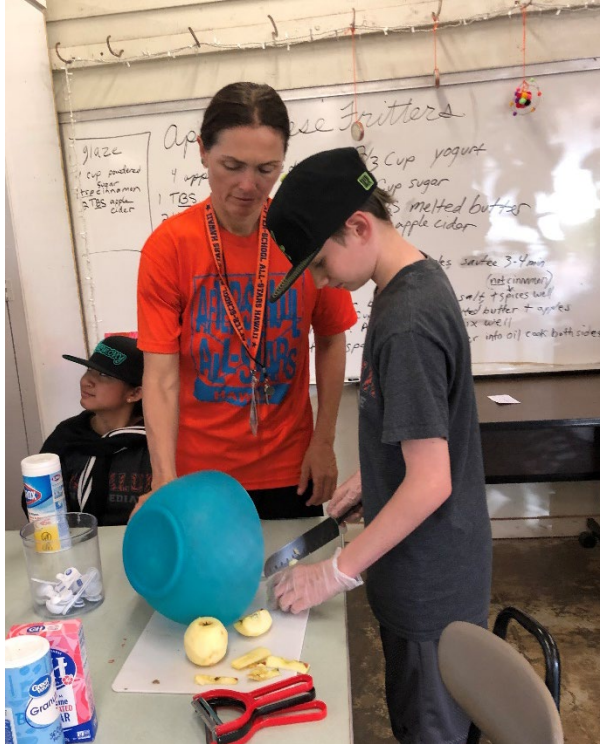

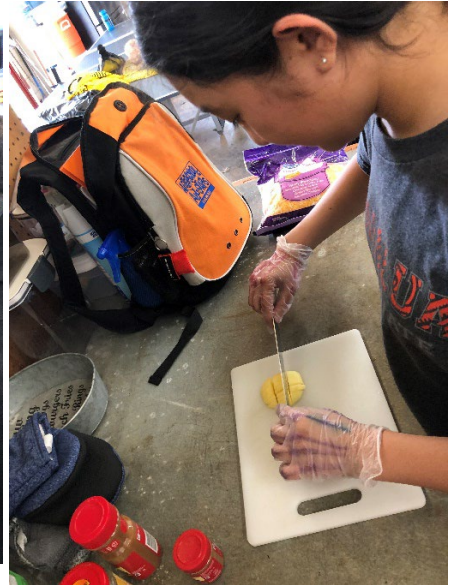
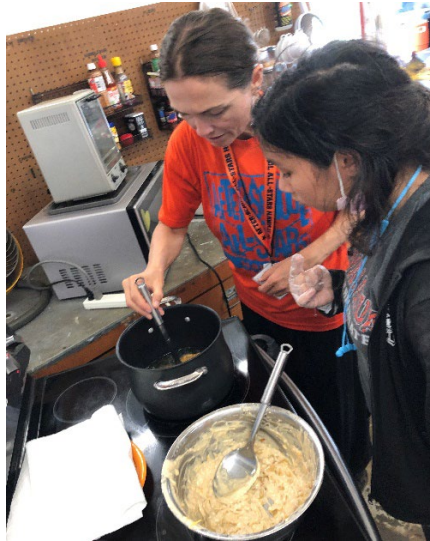
Outdoor volleyball is always a fun time in Multi-Sports. The students get competitive and encourage each other throughout the class. When a point is scored they celebrate and hype one another.

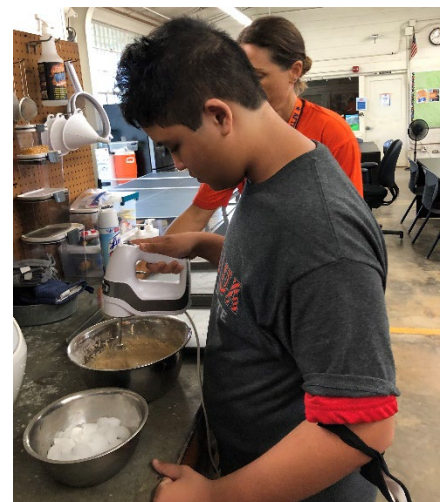
Our JPS Football Season has come to an end but we are so proud of these Junior Bulldogs for putting in the work on and off the field

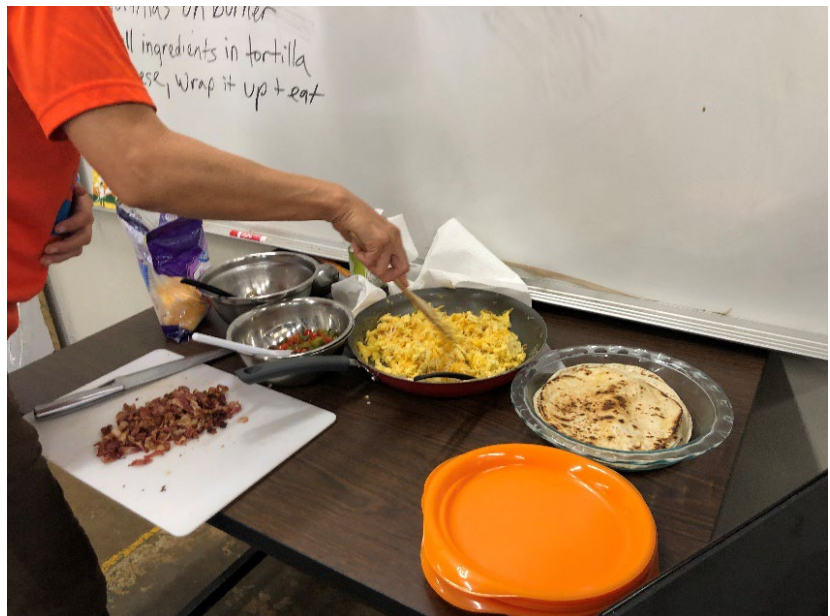
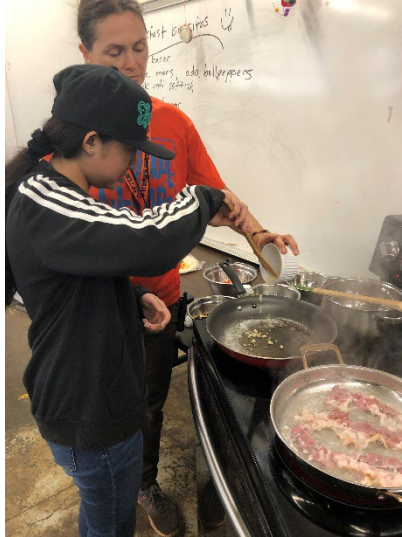
