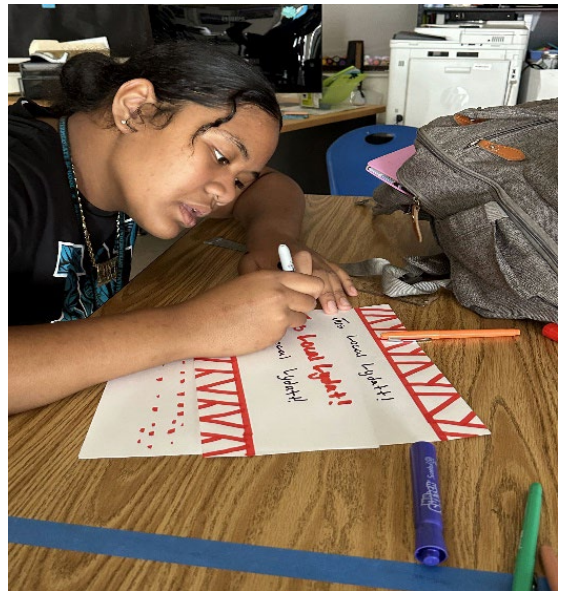


Students work on resin pieces, which require measuring and mixing of the right amount of material so that their pieces will set right and harden.

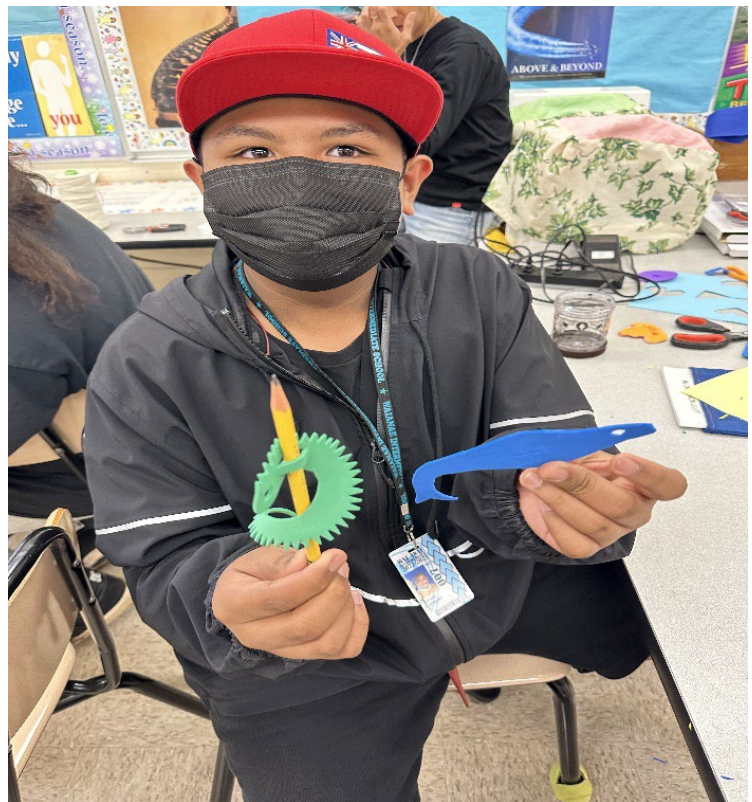


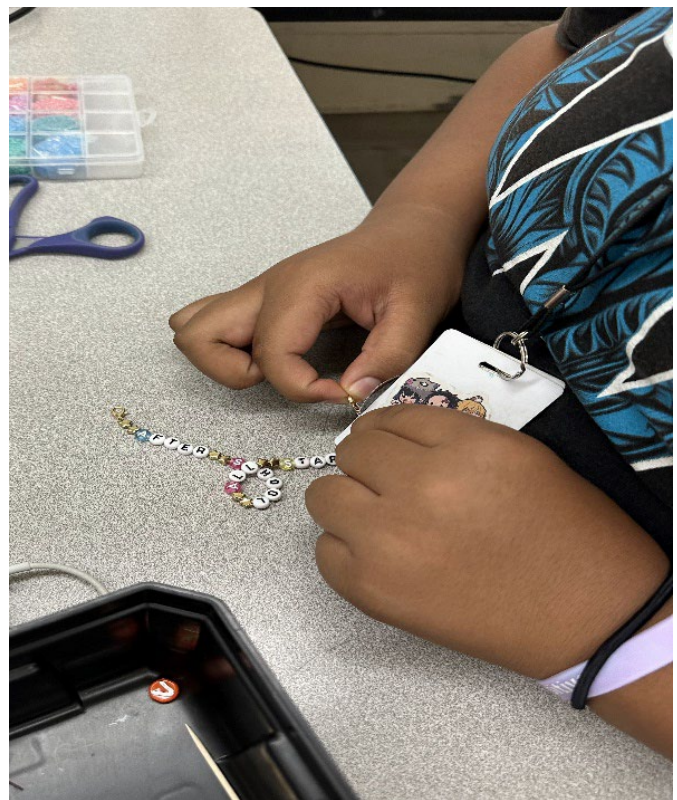

OTHER HIGHLIGHTS



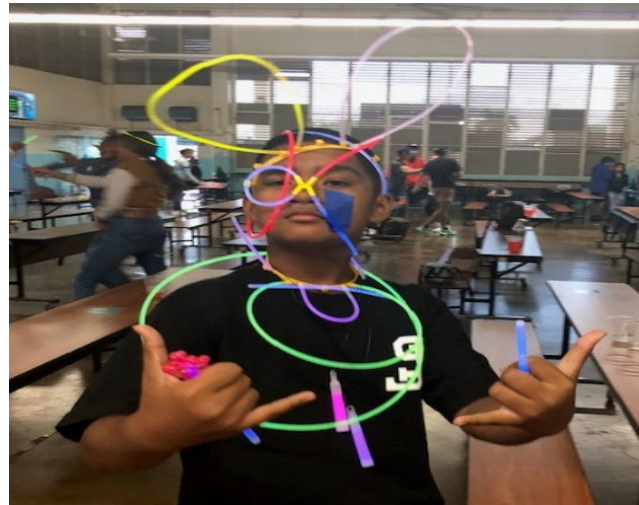
