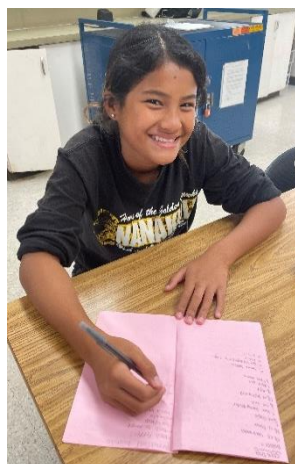

HOIKE

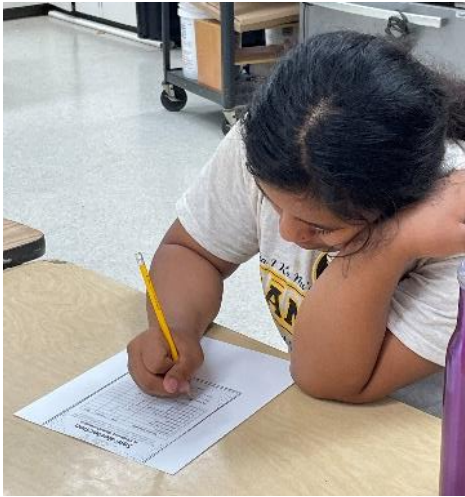


We celebrated the end of Quarter 4, and the end of the school year, with a dance party Ho'ike. We had hula performances, photo props, food, shave ice and a dance floor.

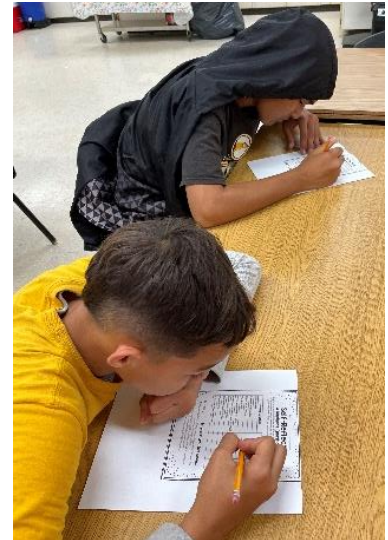
We recognized our students with the best attendance by raffling off prizes and crowned our ASAS King and Queen for showing All-Star qualities every day this quarter.

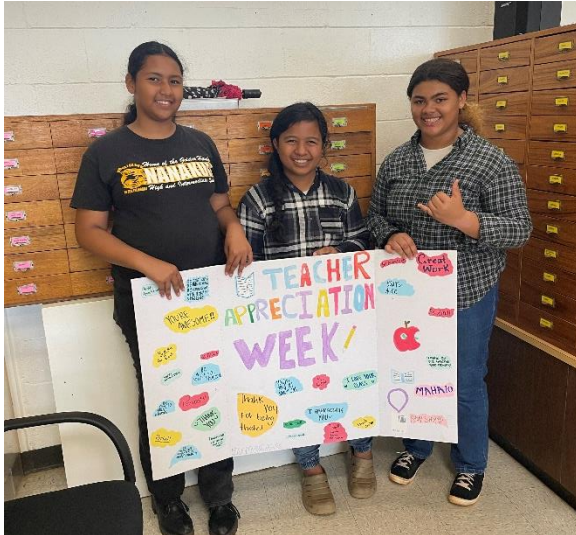

At the end of the presentation our students understood what they needed to do to help make a change and put an end to littering.



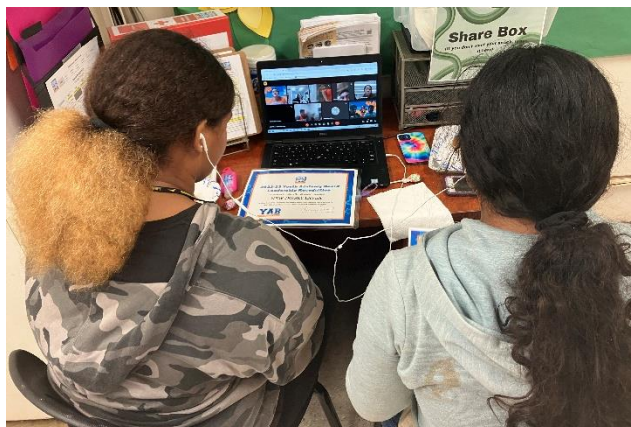
