

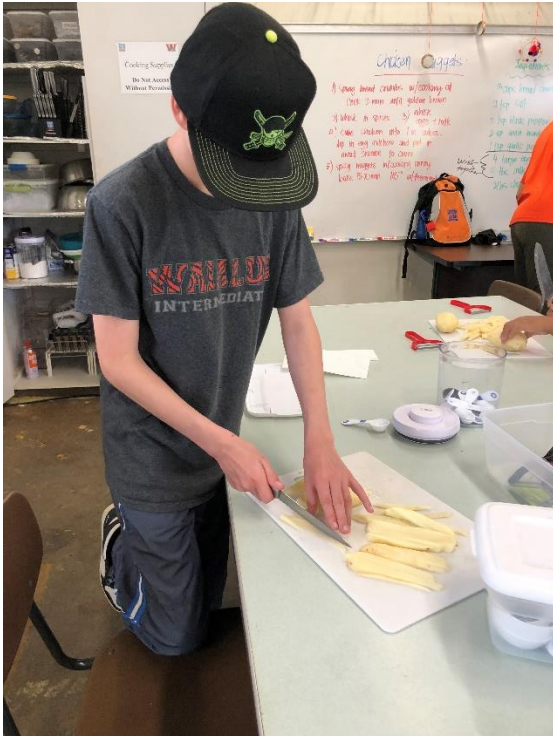

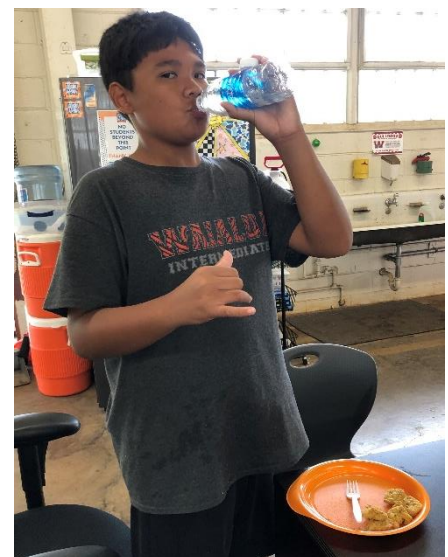

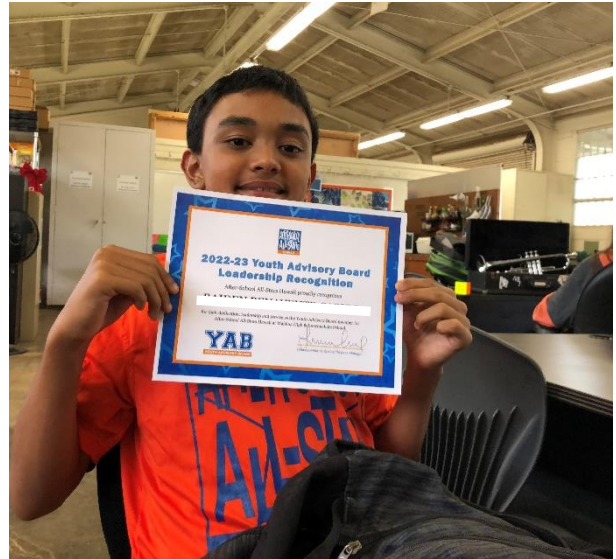

During Teacher Appreciation Week, students wrote Thank You cards to the school staff and teachers.

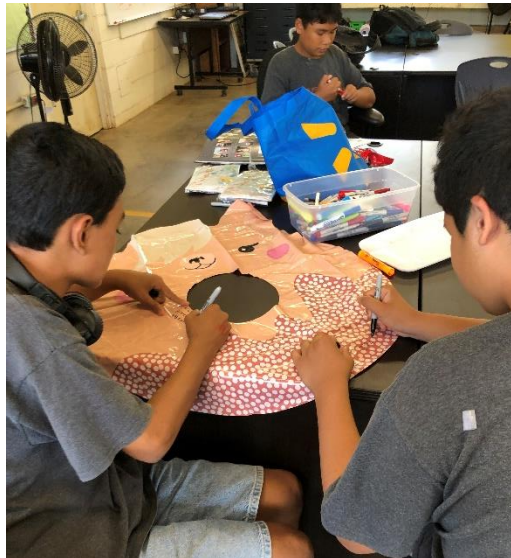
