

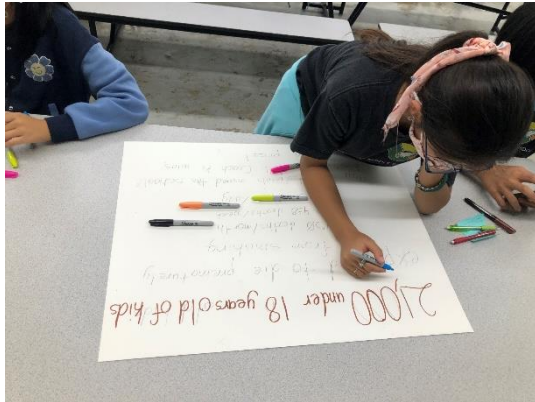

The art classes played a big role in getting our various posters put together, but still had some time to spend creating for themselves.



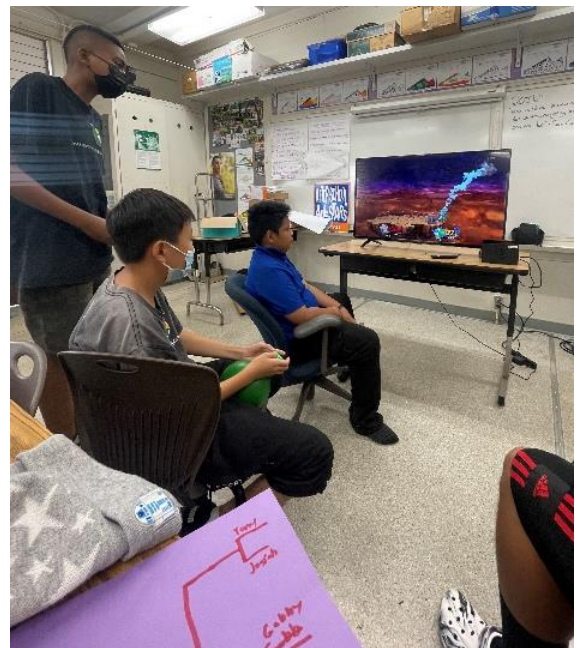
Dance class got to explore new cultures as they prepared for their Ho'ike performance.

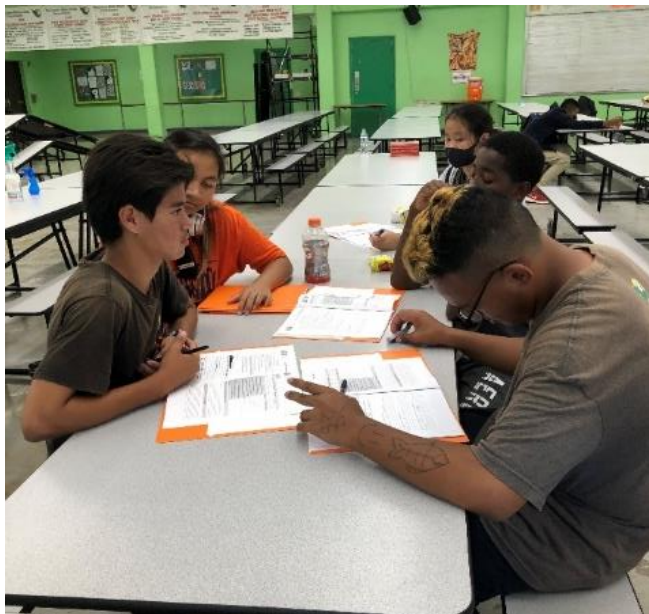
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SPECIAL EVENTS/CURRICULUM

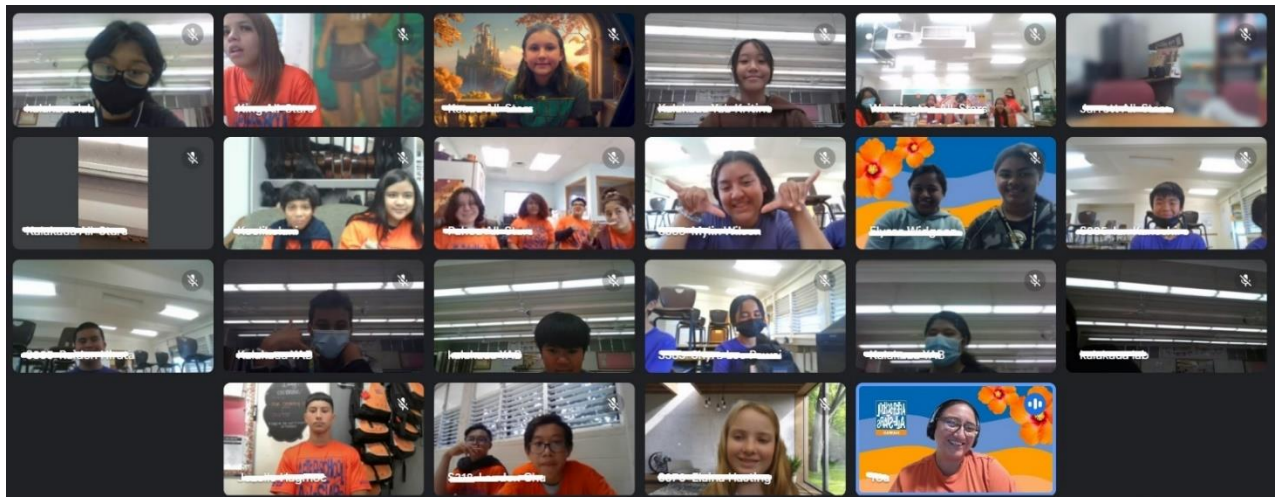
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YOUTH ADVISORY BOARD

Even though it was water day, students still had a learning experience as they had to work together to launch balloons from side to the other.

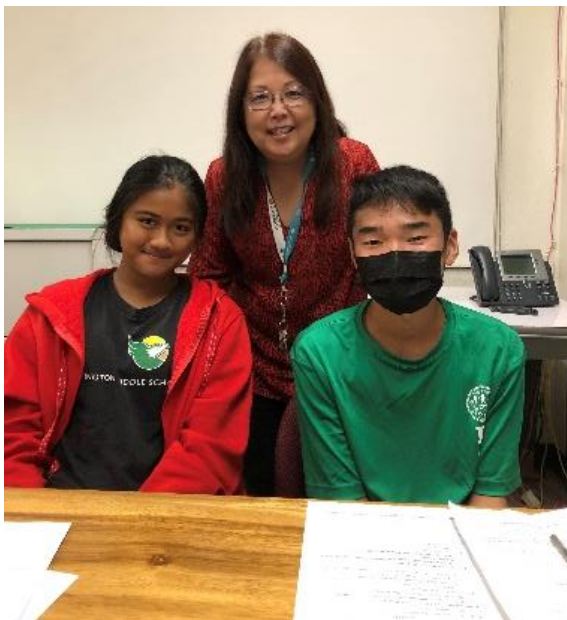
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OTHER HIGHLIGHTS
