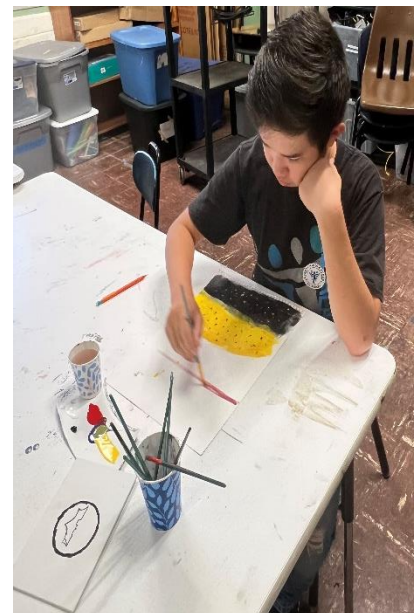
In Archery class the students learn how to safely shoot arrows, engage and build relationships with each other through friendly competitions and encourage each other to improve through feedback and challenge.

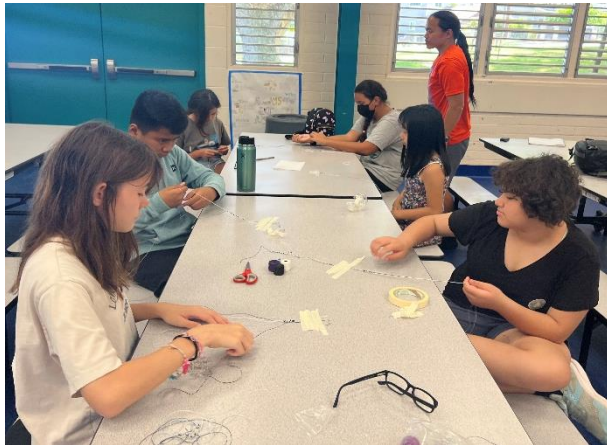




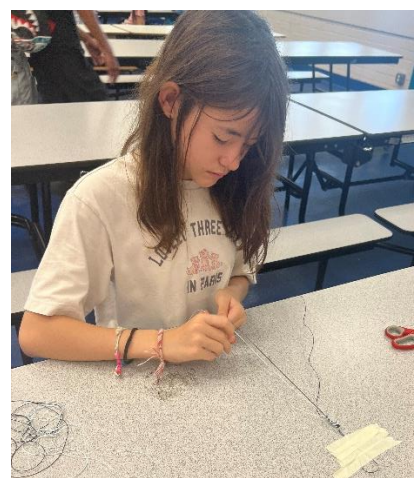
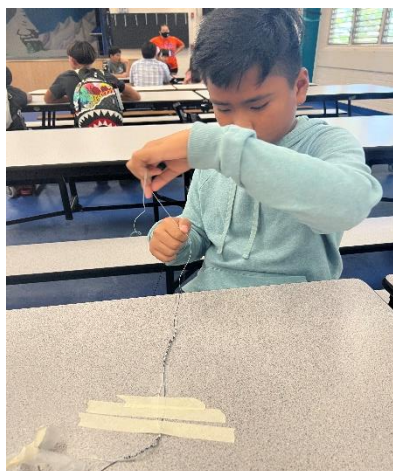
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#### CLASSES

Our All-Stars ended their summer field trips by going to Aiea Bowl. They had so much fun!

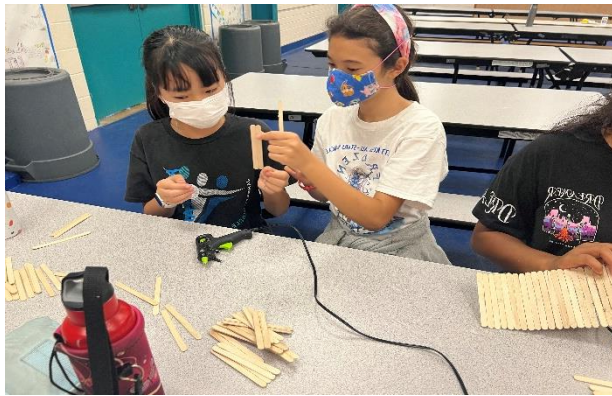




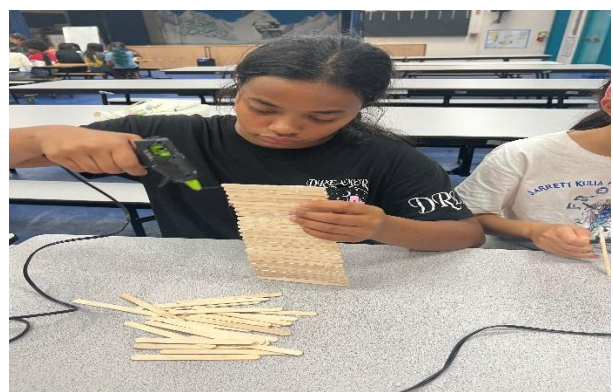
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#### STEM
