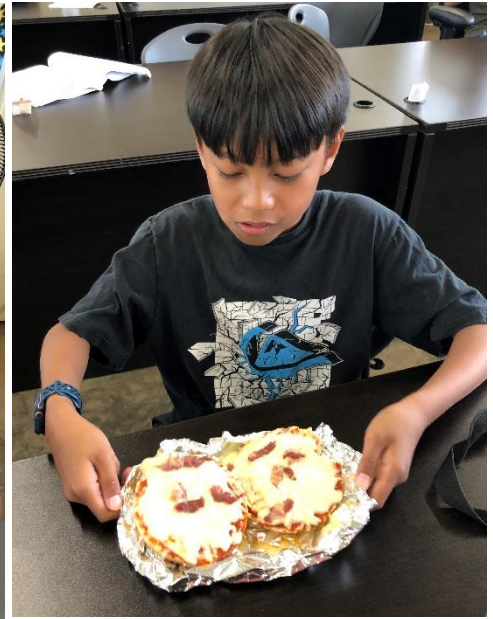


In Outdoor Games, students played a game of Capture the Frisbee. The objective is to take all of the other teams frisbees while avoiding getting tagged.

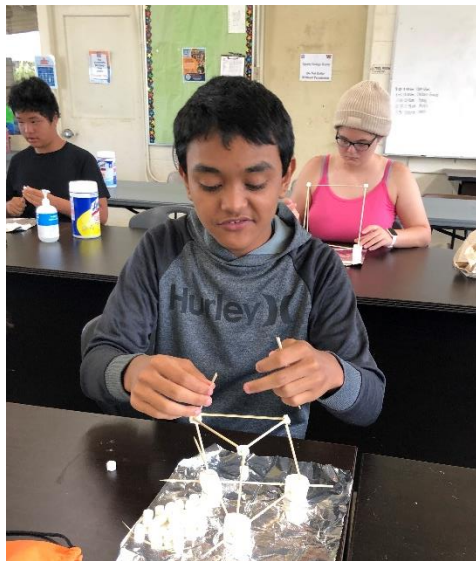

Kickball was another one of our team favorites in Outdoor Games. The students maintained impressive defense and communication in their game by staying low and shouting for plays.

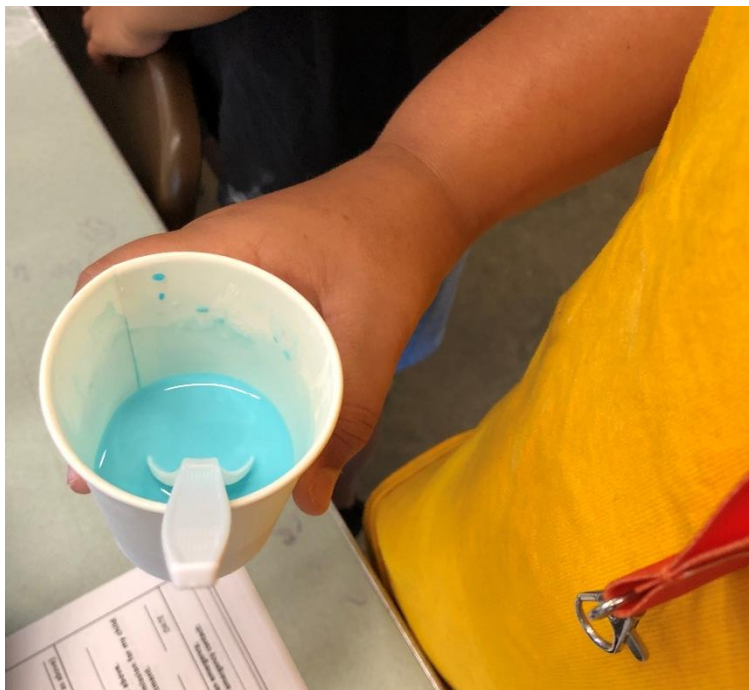

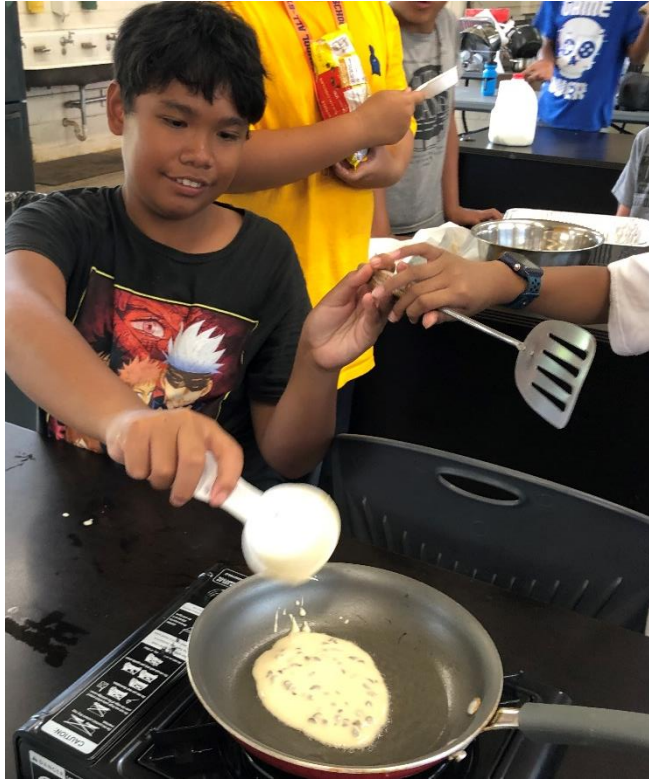


Cooking Class loves to make chocolate chip cookies and fresh fruit smoothies on hot days in Waialua. It is such a yummy treat on a hot sunny day.
