At first students were shy but students came out of their shells by getting to know their groups better and taking part in some fun activities with their Program Leaders.





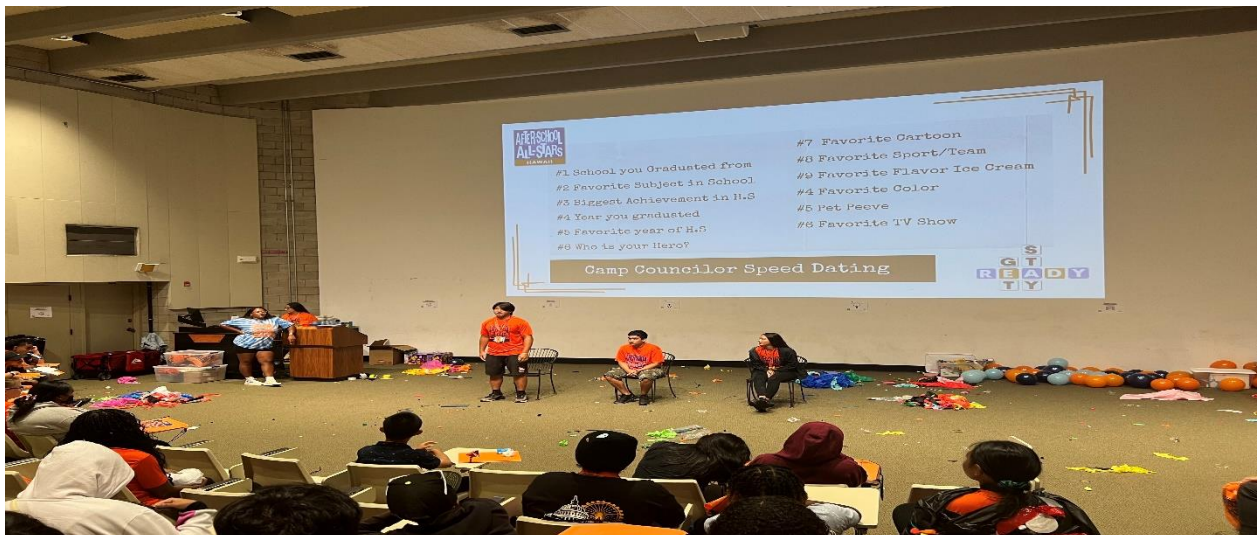

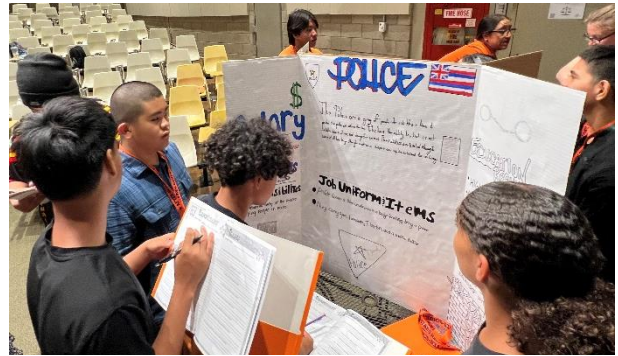
Our students were given a career field topic and were tasked to come up with a job. For three days they did a lot of research as a group with the help of their leaders.



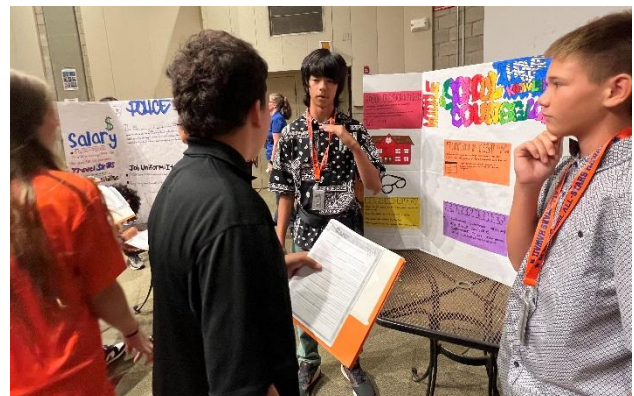
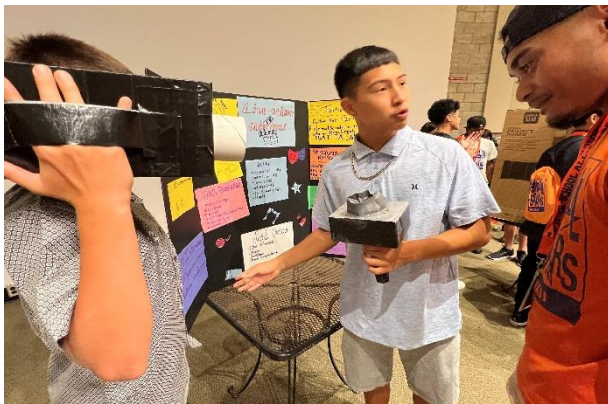

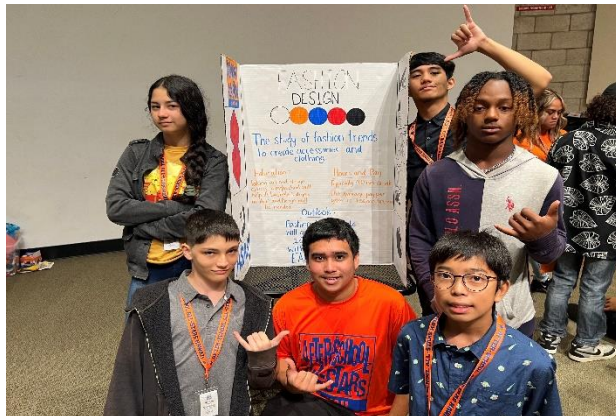
After all the hours and research, the All-Star students held a job fair to allow students to talk about the careers they researched. This was the most exciting part for the students. They all learned about different job opportunities.



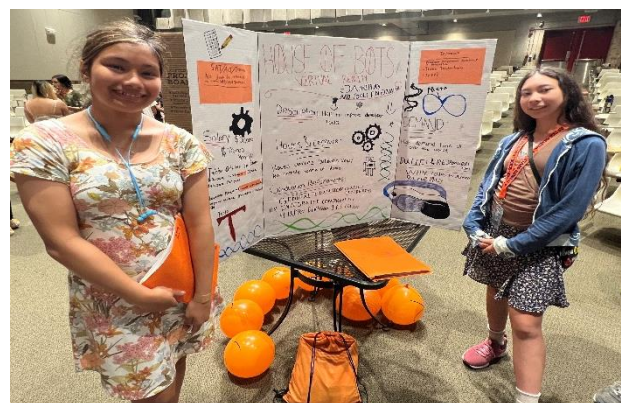

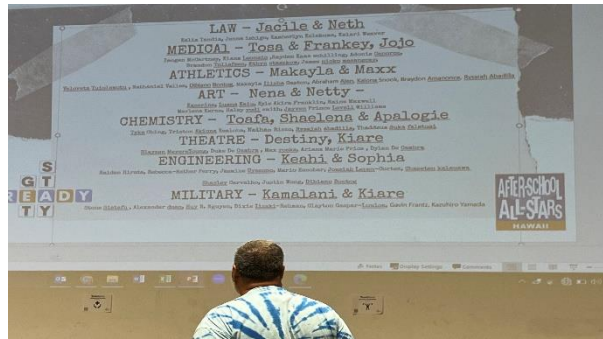
They were all so proud of what they had accomplished for the job fair and so were all the All-Star leaders.

Guest speakers from the University, and beyond, spoke with our students and let them know about a variety of different career paths



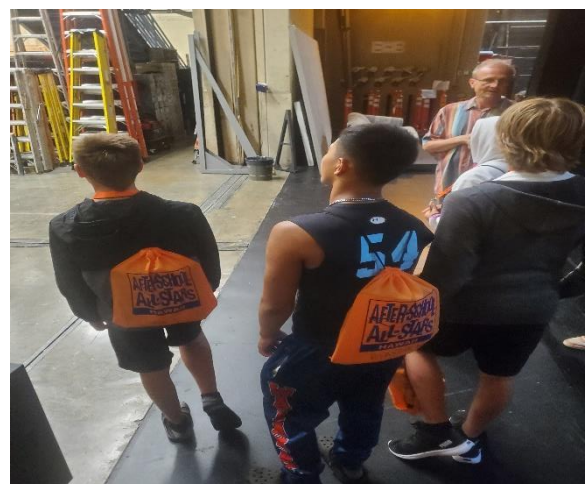

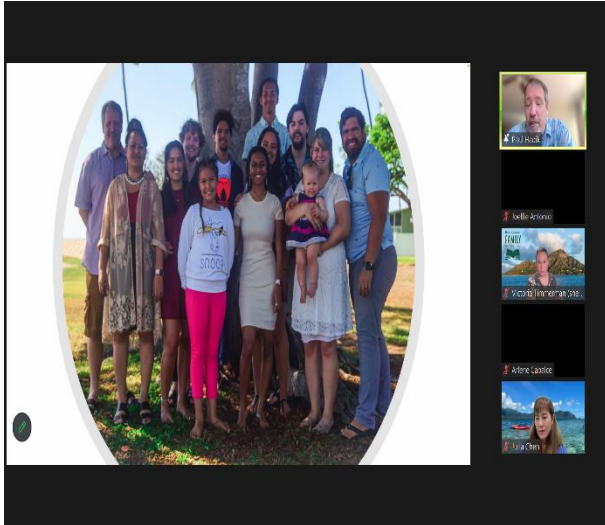
It's Registration Day! Our All-Star staff came out to promote All-Stars and meet the new students and their parents.

All-Stars staff attended a workshop with Paul Hadik who talked with us about Supporting Micronesian Families in Hawai'i. He helped us to better understand the culture and how we can meet the needs of our students.

Traditional Island Education Systems

- Students learned a specific island life skill which benefited the community. (We vs I)
- Teachers were often family members and elders. (effects communication-silence, "yes", gestures)
- Knowledge was transmitted orally, and information was memorized. (Very little reading)
- Cultural Activities ARE seen as part of an education.
