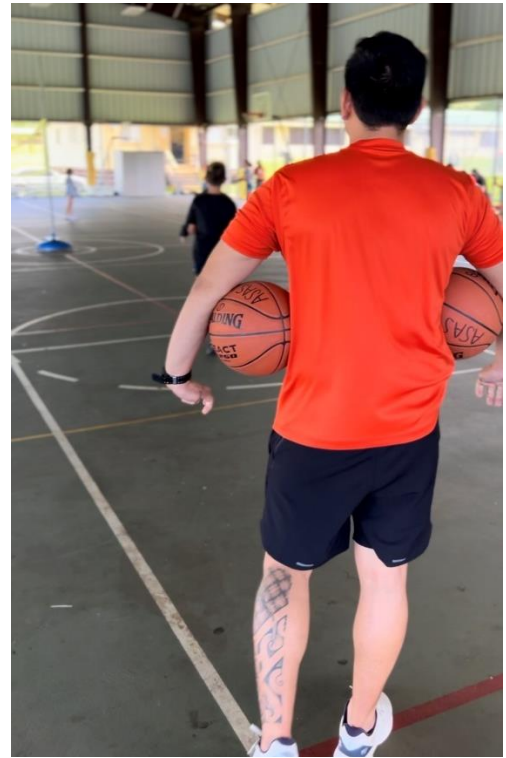

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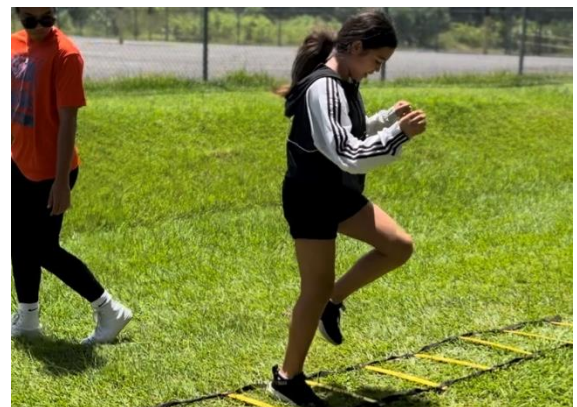

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FIELD TRIPS



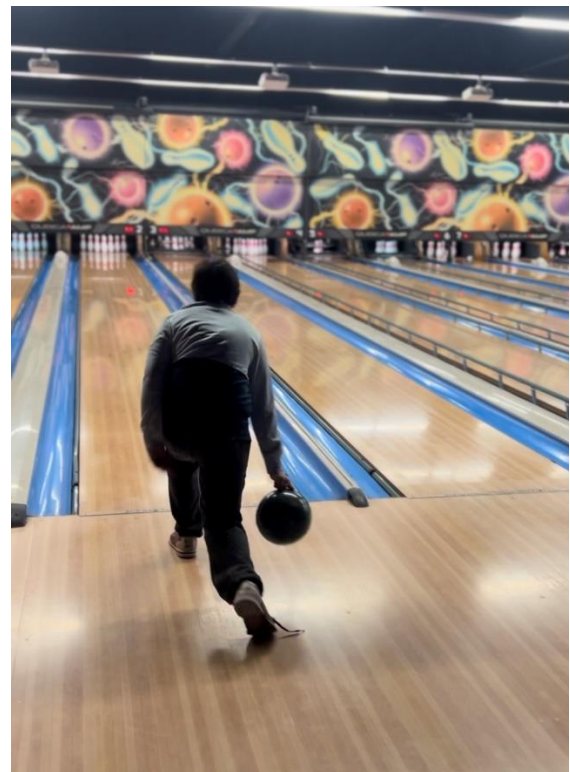

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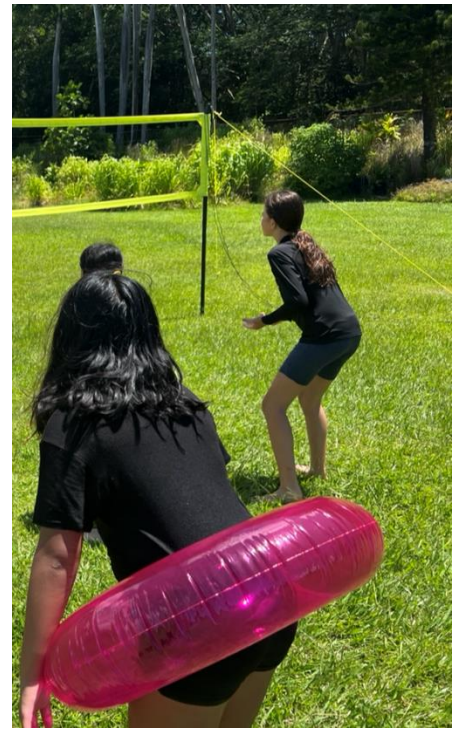
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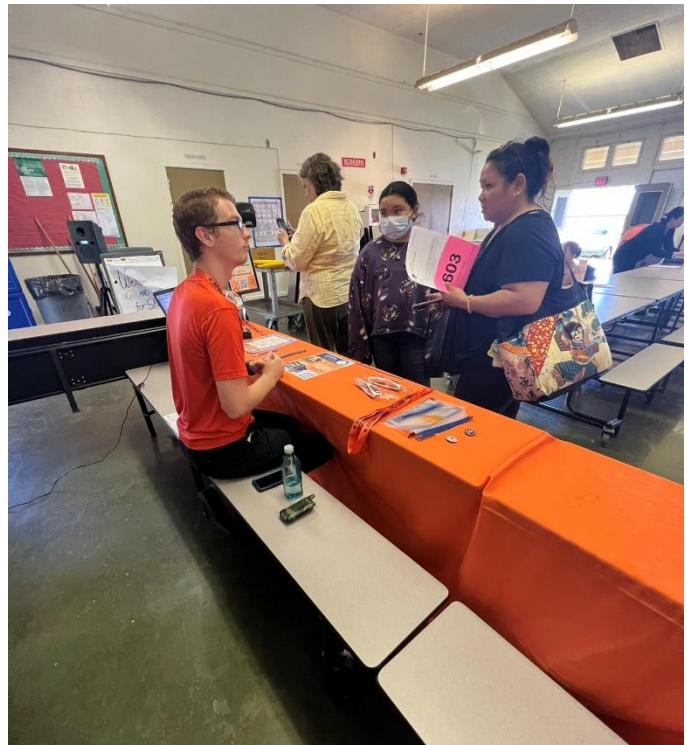
On the last day of program students participated in Water day with the opportunity to do the slip and slide and play some volleyball.



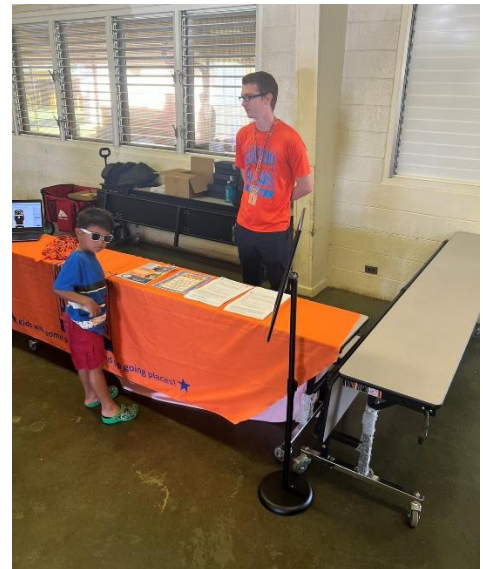
