Students in ukulele also showed improvement in skill as they learned new songs as well as gained better understanding of the instrument.

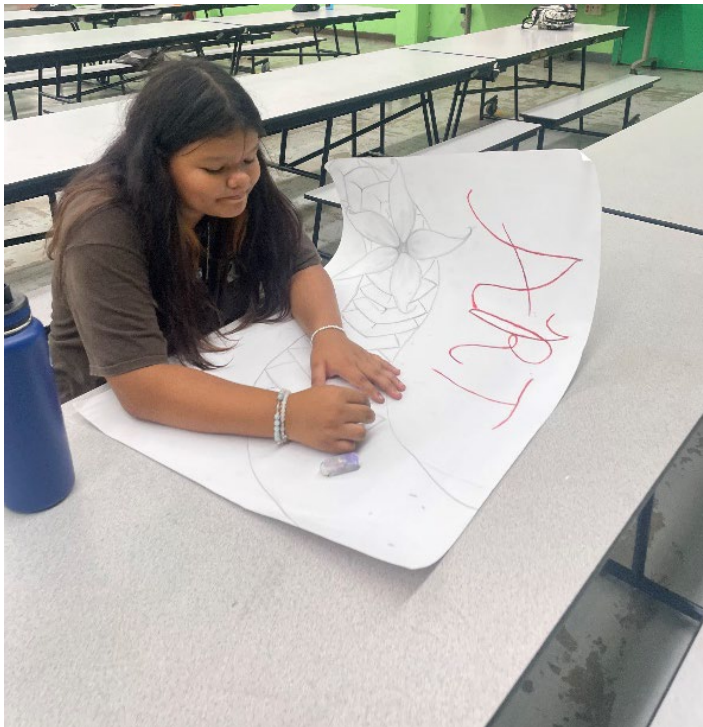


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Students in softball class work on their swings, as they seek to improve their fundamentals in this sport.

For STEM, the students used everyday school materials to build catapults/sling shots to shoot ping pong balls.

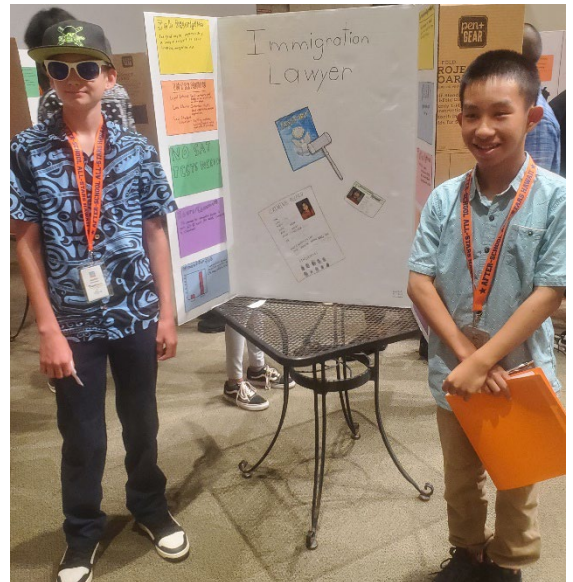
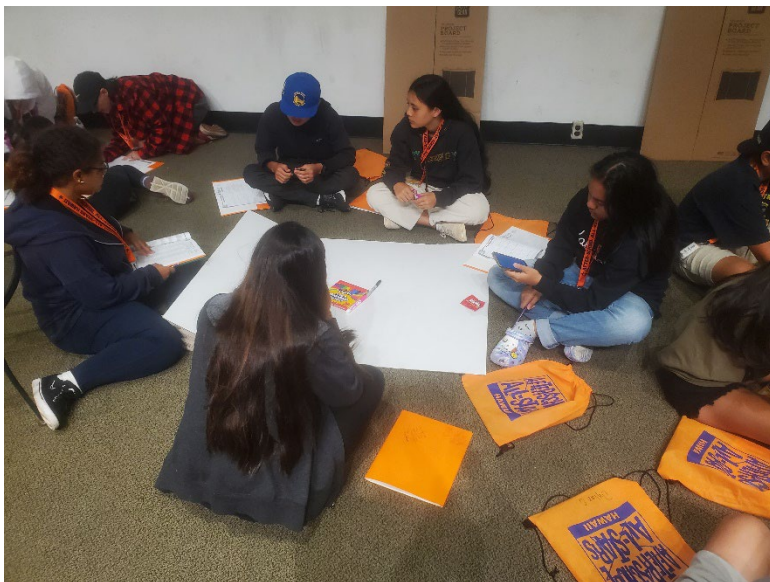
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CAMP READY

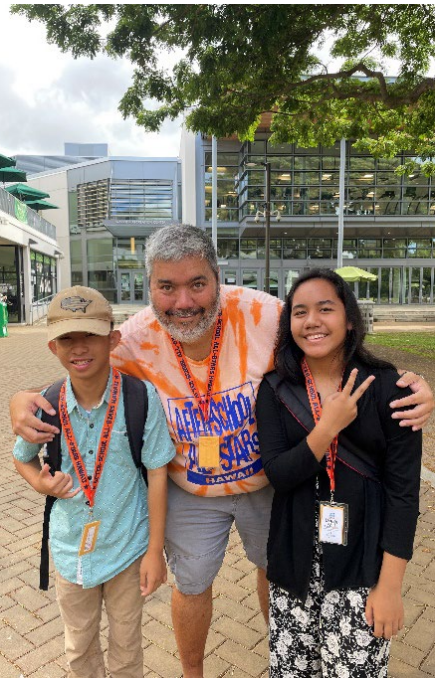

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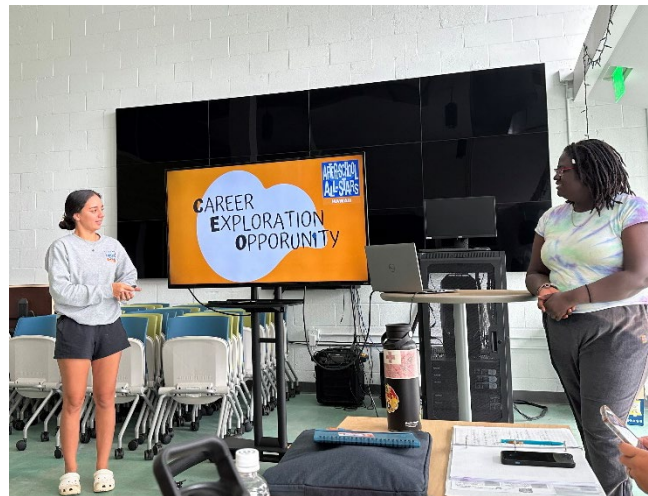
