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Students in Painting explored different styles and techniques of art as they express their creativity on their own ASAS swag.



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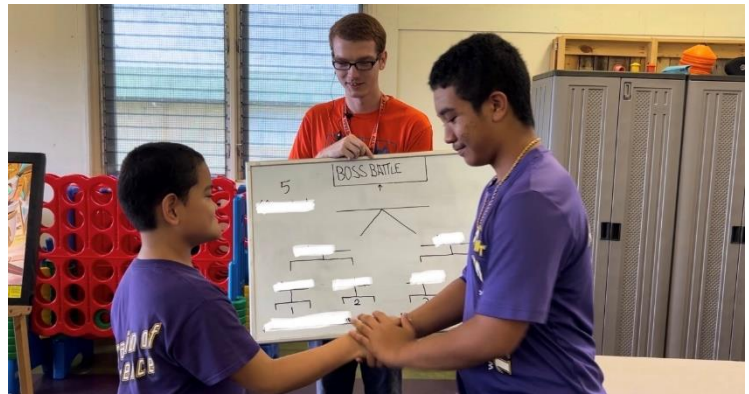


Multi-Sports and Mix-it-Up Sports get things heated with class competitions in kickball, frisbee and more. Which class will come out on top?



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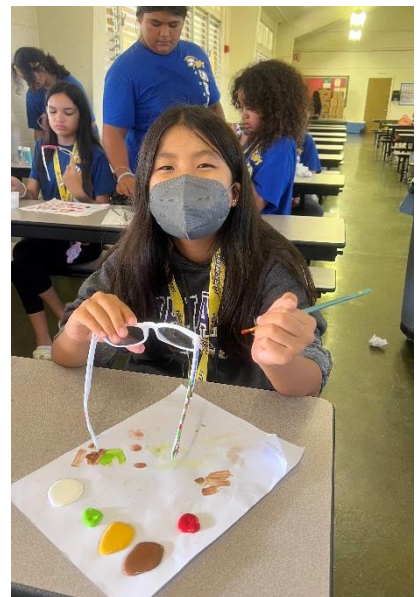

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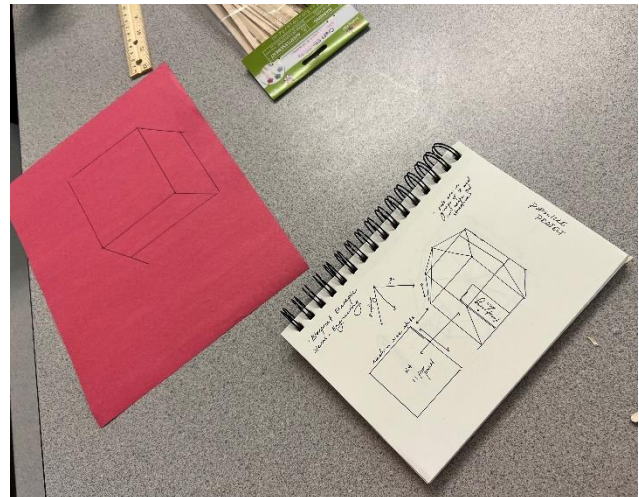
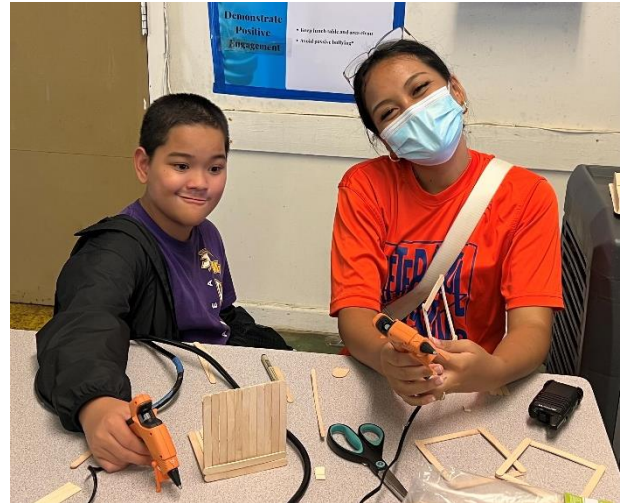
SERVICE LEARNING PROJECT – LIFE SERVICE ACTION
