CLASSES



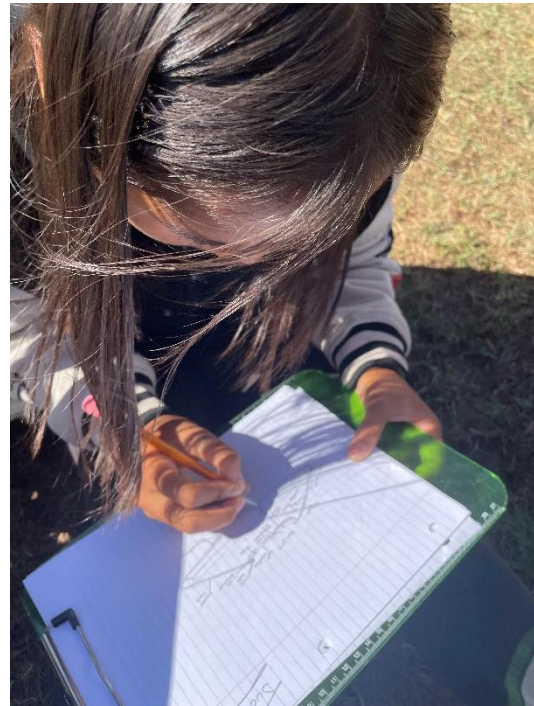
Volleyball class got an opportunity to scrimmage against Boys and Girls Club to get a feel for competition and team dynamics.

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Students in our eSports class have turned up the dial on competition as they have been participating in more team-based game play.



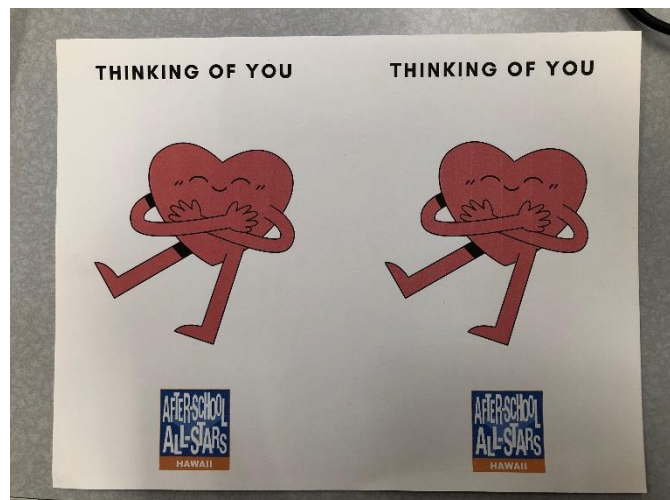
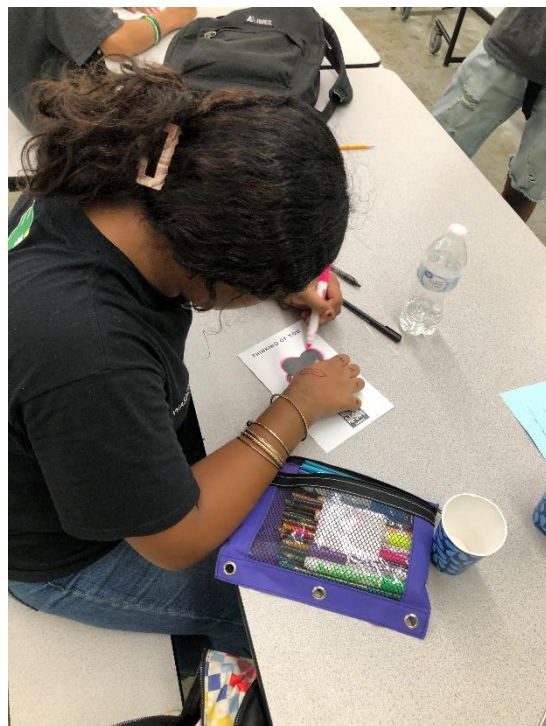
Ukulele class took their class outside to help set the right vibes. They are preparing for their performance at Hoike.
