Students at Waiakea All-Stars have been creating works of living art like paper flowers and leis. Students enjoy bringing their finished products home to show their families.





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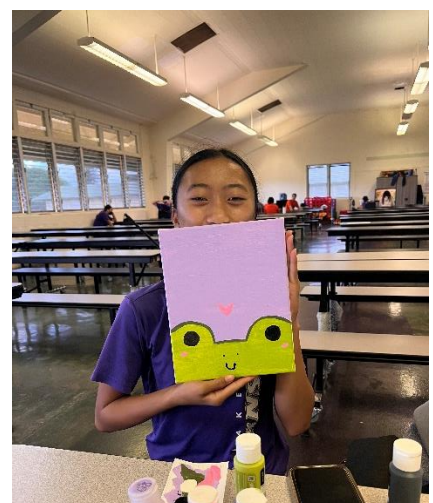
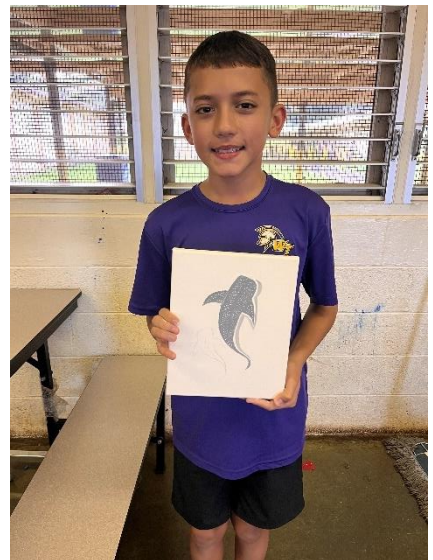
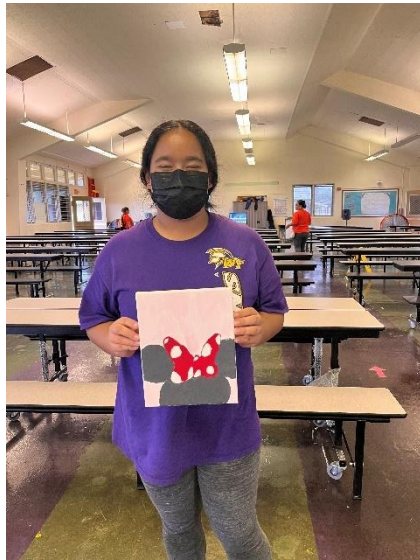


Basketball class have been competing at a high level, developing their skills through drills and friendly games like King of the Court and 21.

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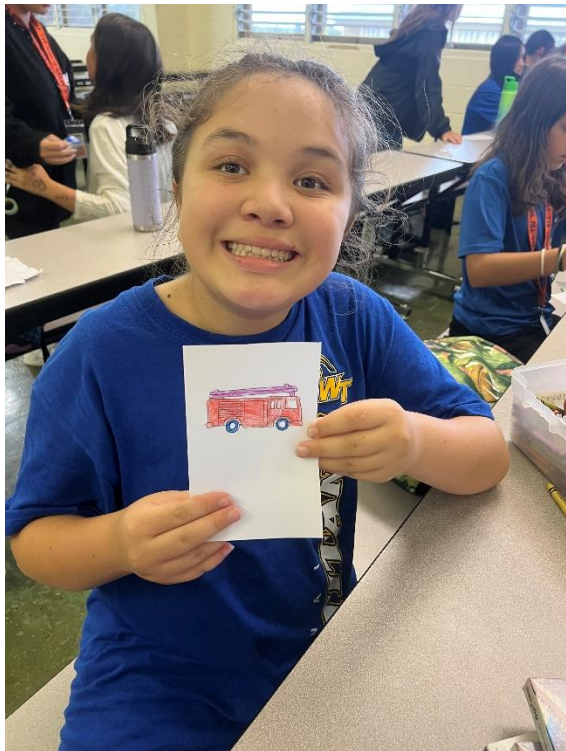
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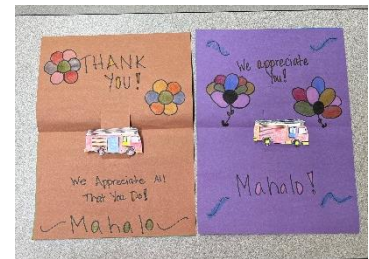
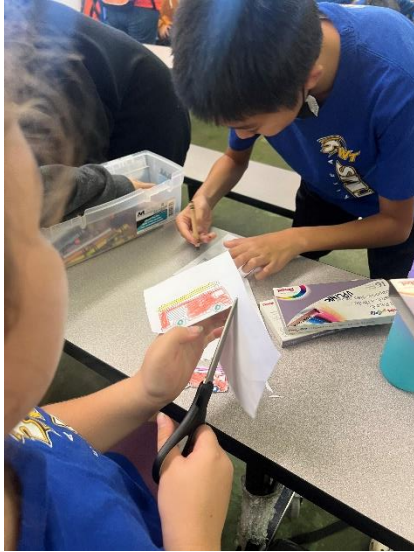
SERVICE LEARNING PROJECT – LIFE SERVICE ACTION

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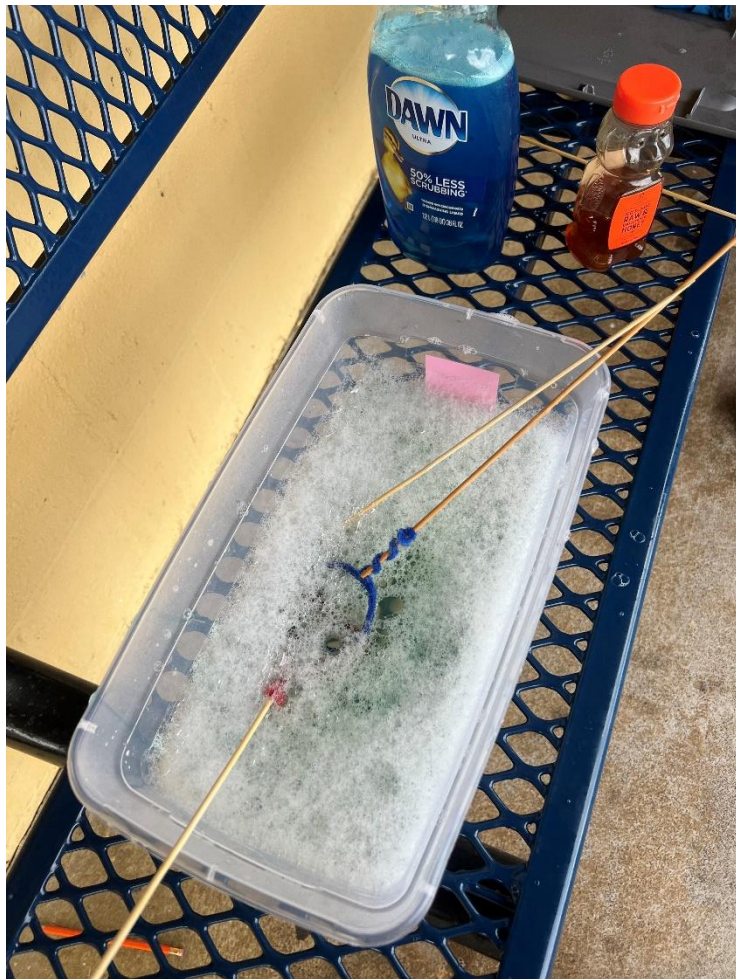
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STEM

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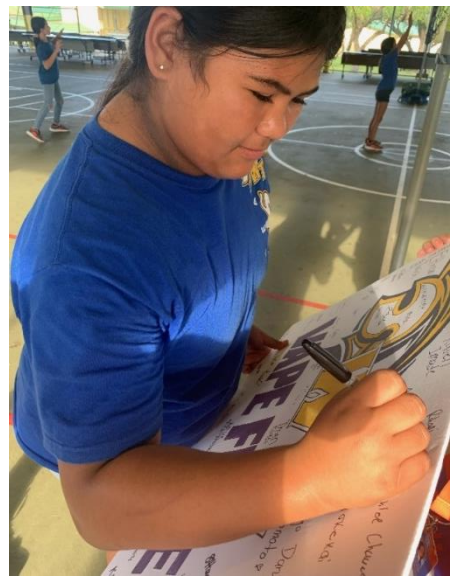
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OTHER HIGHLIGHTS

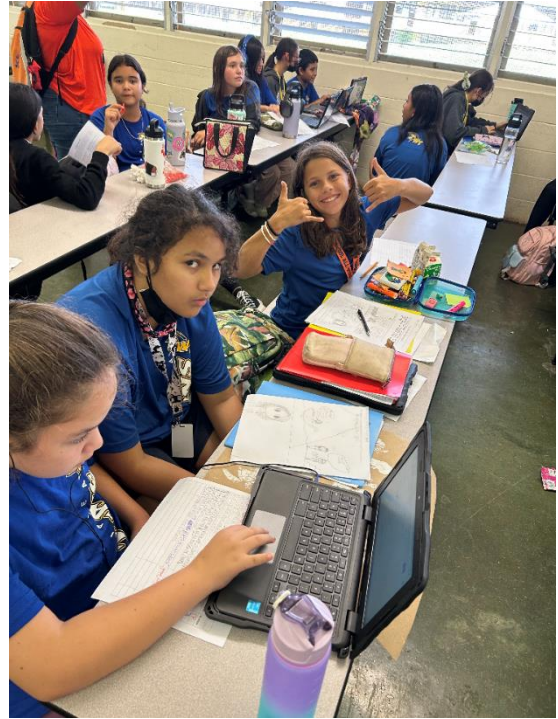




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A DAY IN PROGRAM
