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Students in eSports take part in a competition against Washington Middle School. Though they did not walk away with the win, they did learn a lesson on how important team building and communication skills are.

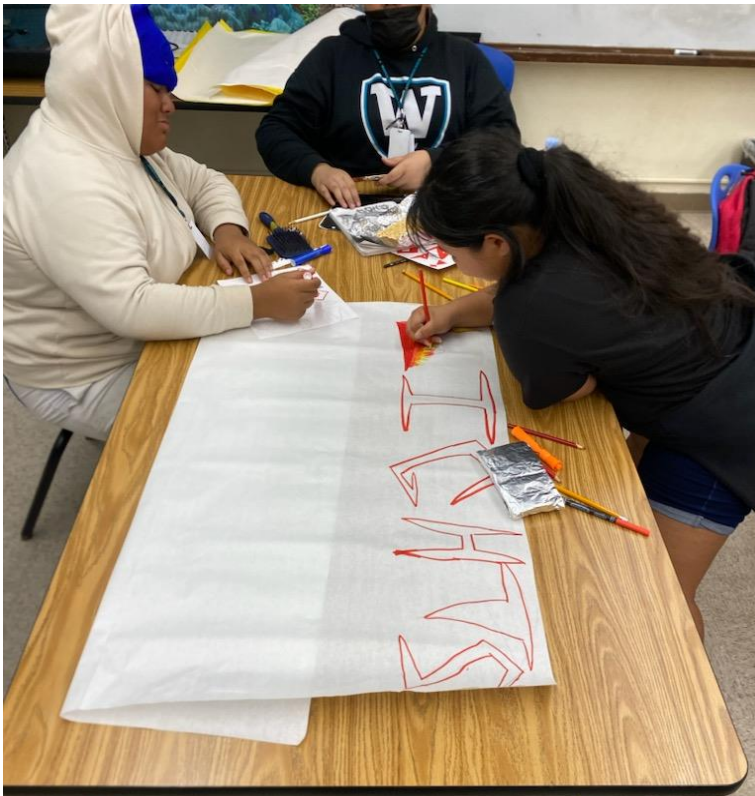
