




Dance Class is ramping up rehearsals, as Hoike draws closer, but they still have opportunities to let loose and have fun.






Football Class has been able to find competition scrimmaging against the Boys and Girls Club of Hawaii. The competition helps the students learn what areas they need improvement in.


SPECIAL EVENTS/CURRICULUM


SERVICE LEARNING PROJECT – LIFE SERVICE ACTION
