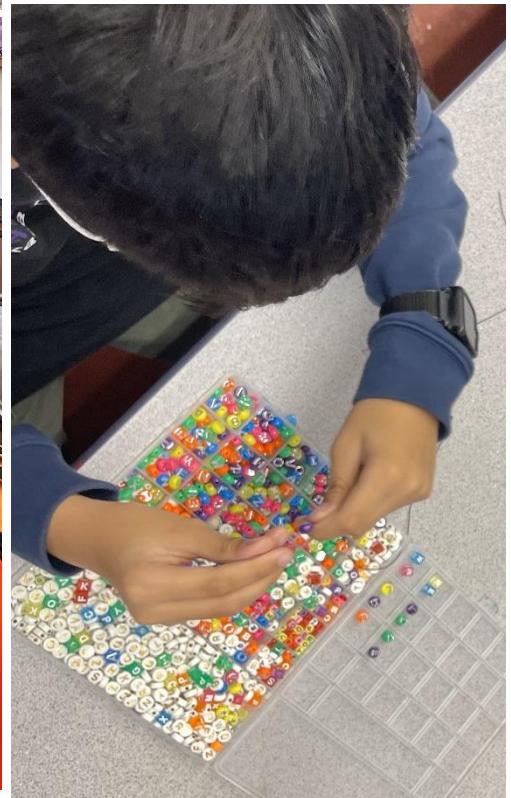

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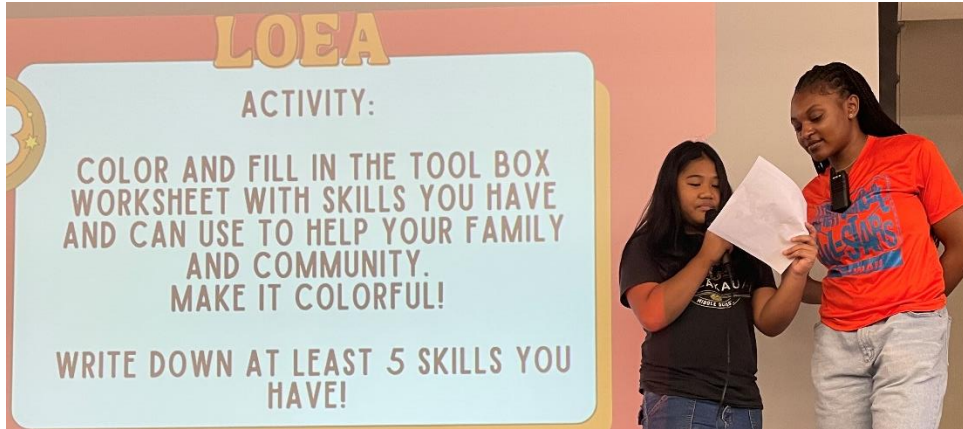


Softball has learned a lot from Coach Emily this month. They are excited for ASAL games next quarter!
