COOKING

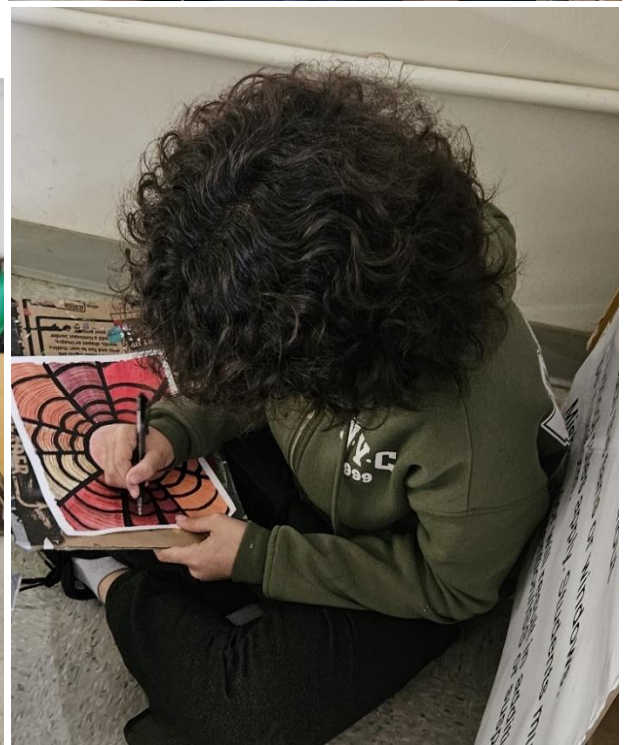

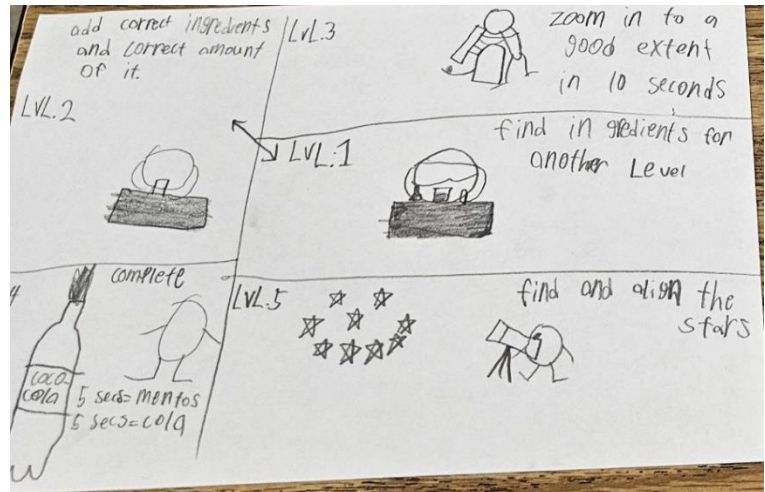


GAME DESIGN
