Students in We Are Ready class are taken through scenarios that teach them the importance of asking for help when they need it. They are taught to seek each other out and to embrace the help of others.



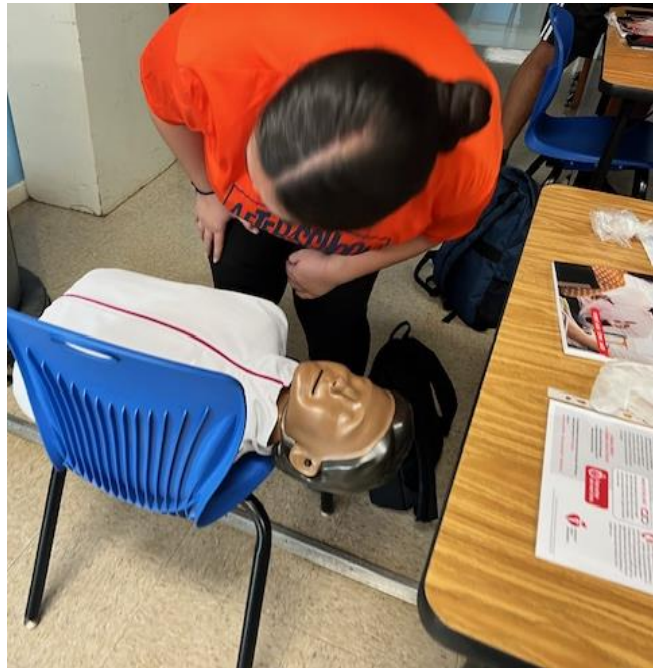
Students taking their post We Are Ready test understands that though college can seem scary when you are away from your love ones, they left knowing they have each other.



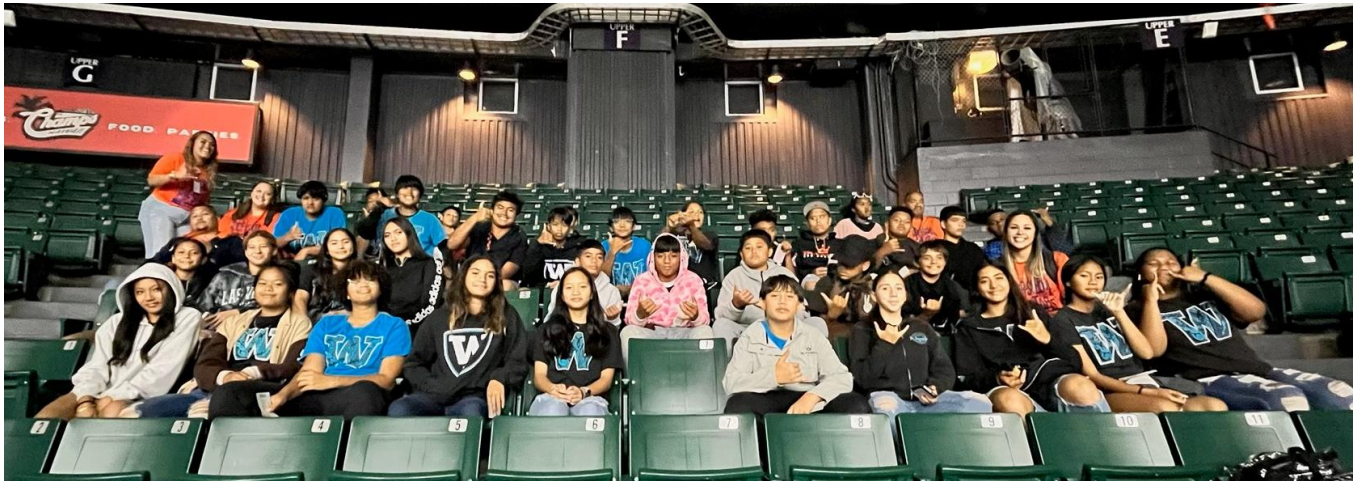
STAFF TRAININGS
