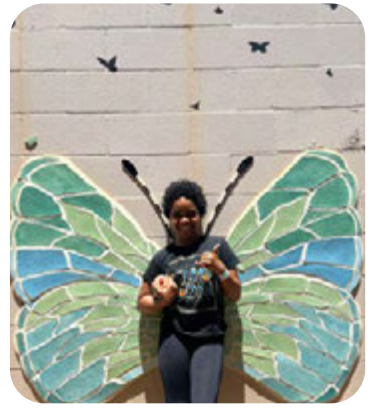




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HONOLULU ZOO FIELD TRIP

Our summer Sports Showdown was a hit. The All-Stars favorite part was enjoying a refreshing shave ice after a full day of sports under the hot summer sun.

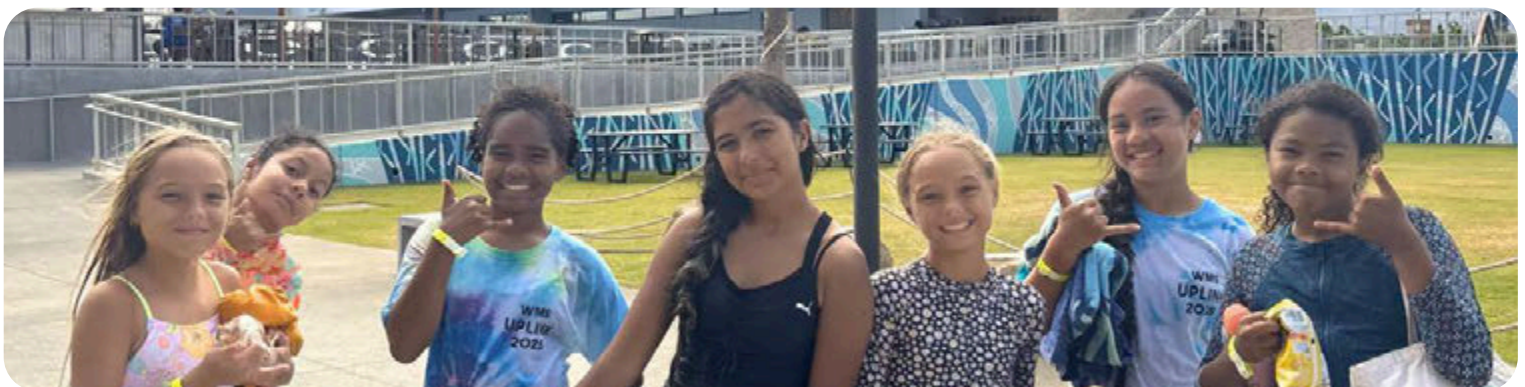




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WAI KAI FIELD TRIP

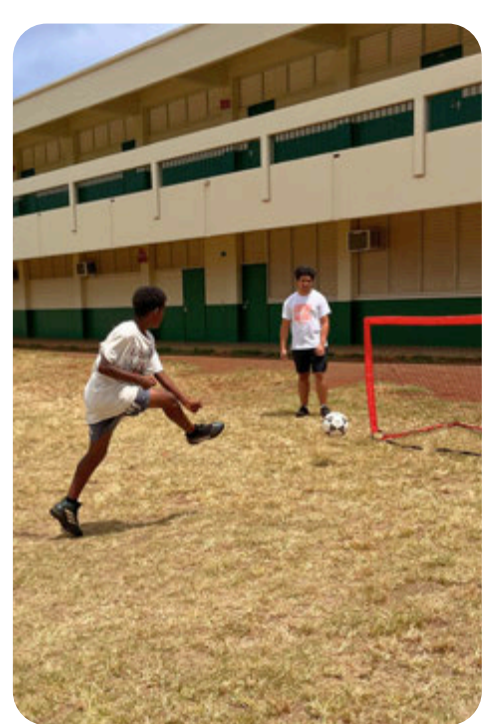




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SOCCKER

Washington All-Stars were excited to kick off a new summer soccer class. Students practiced one-on-one goal-scoring drills that tested their footwork, speed, and decision-making.

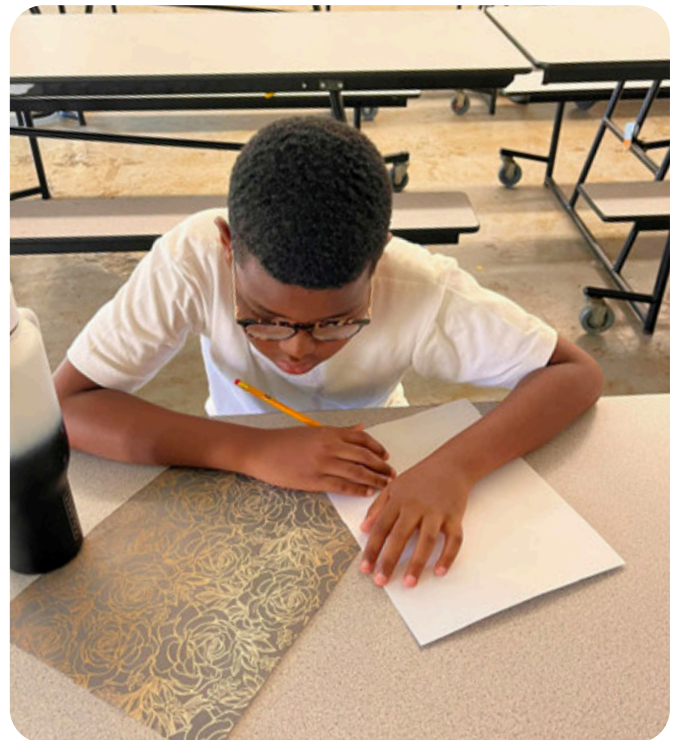




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PAINTING
