Jazz Dance students focused on refining formation and arm placement to improve their performance.



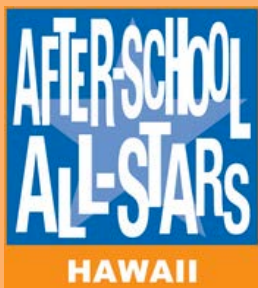


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TENNIS

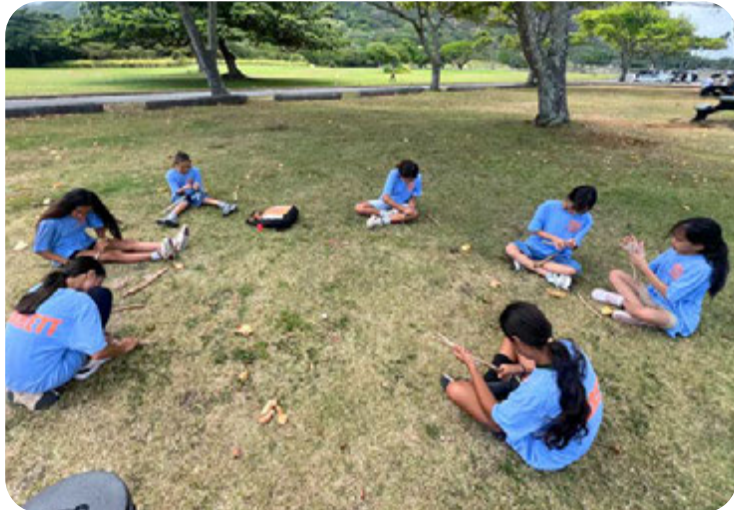




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KUALOA REGIONAL PARK FIELD TRIP

At the beginning of each day, All-Stars students play games that encourage relationship building and teamwork.

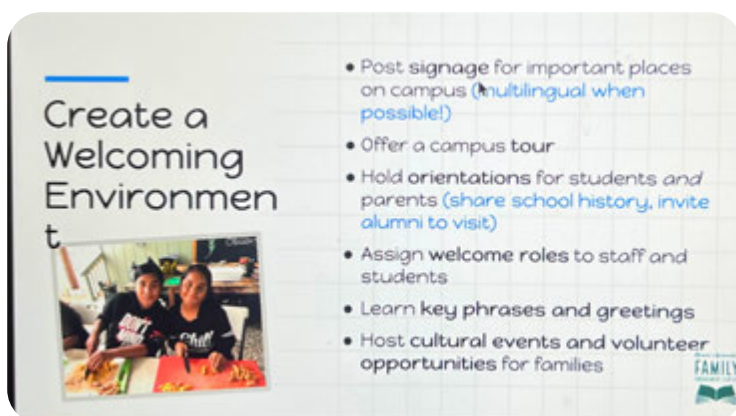
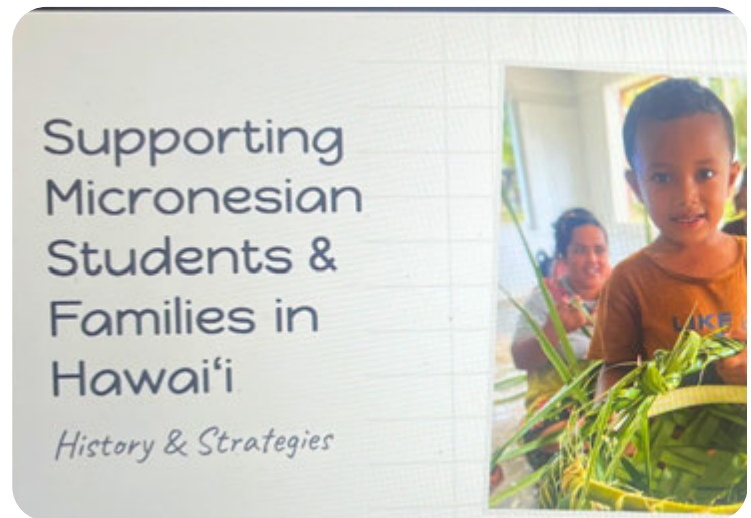
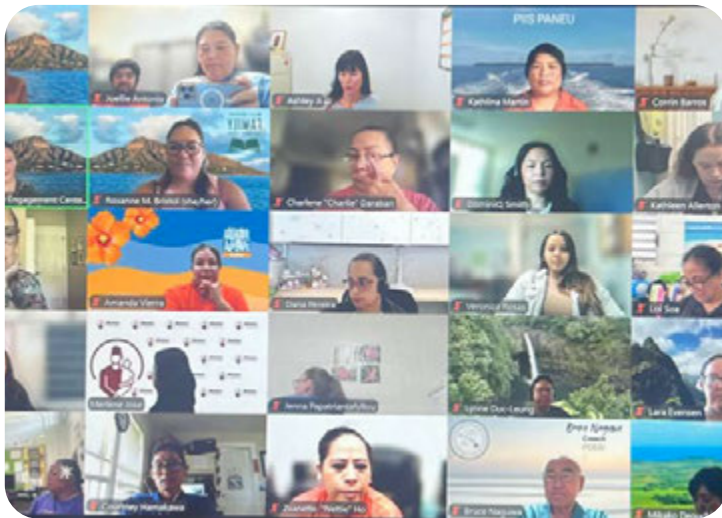


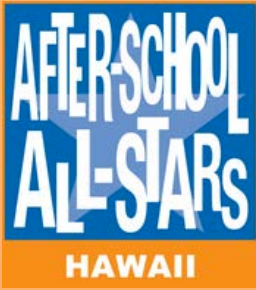


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ATER-SCHOOL ALL-STARS TRAINING

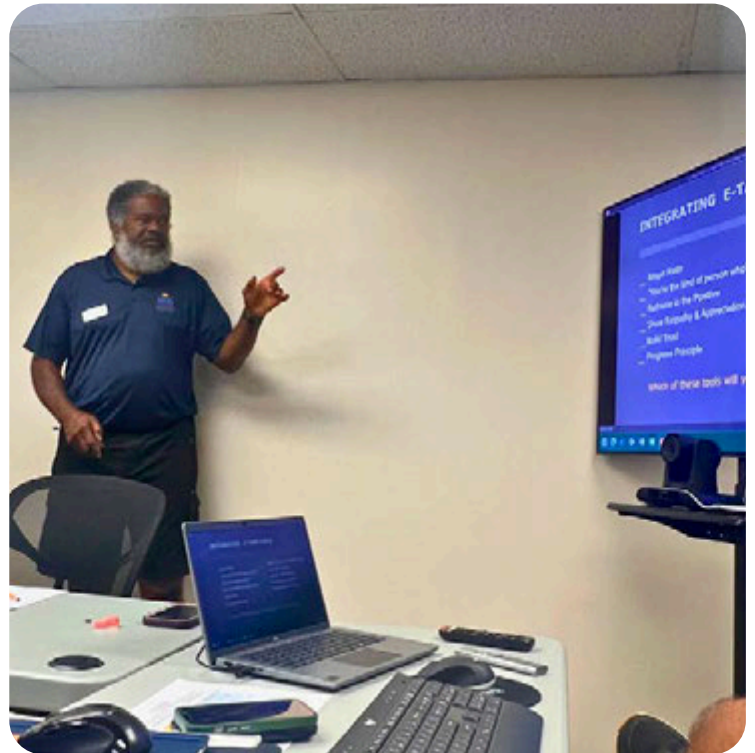




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AFTER-SCHOOL ALL-STARS STAFF TRAINING

On the second day, staff gathered at the main office to review ASAS protocols and complete additional training for the new school year.

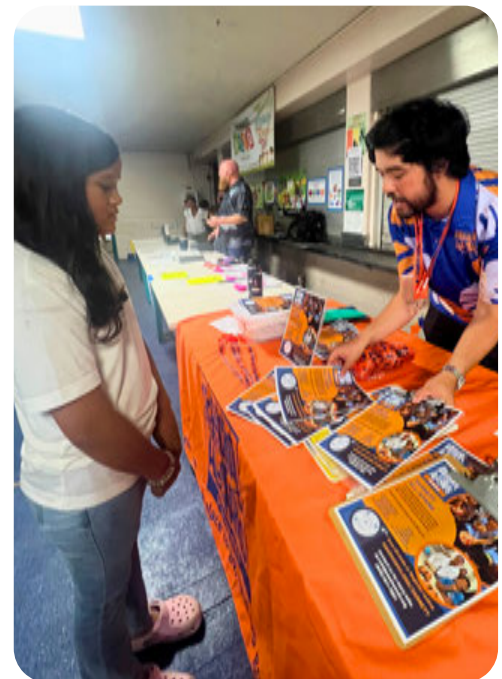




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JARRETT OPEN HOUSE

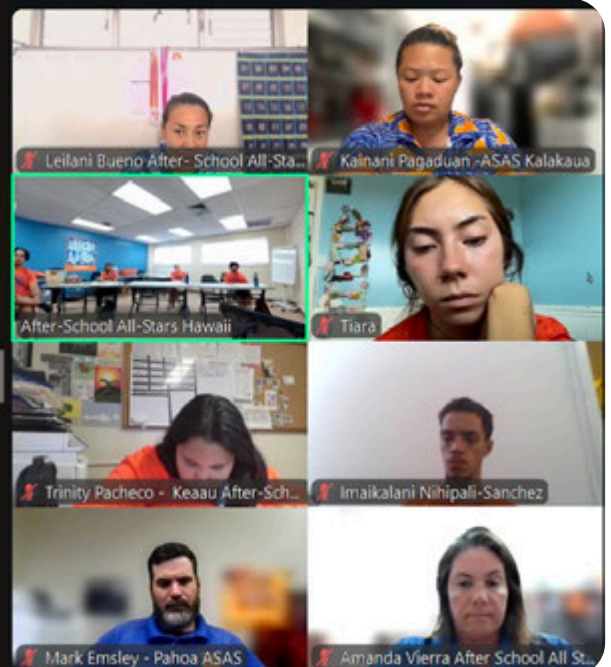
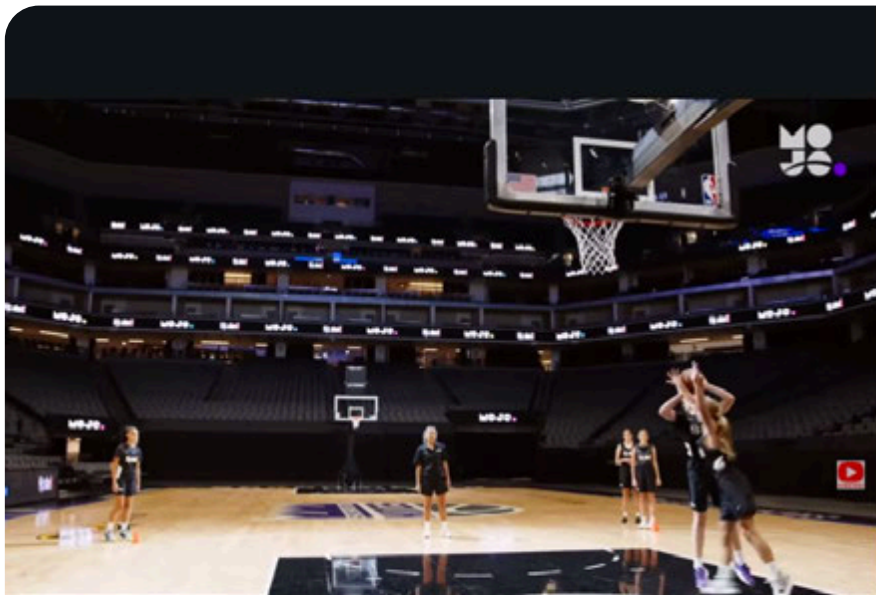
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BASKETBALL CLINIC
