Basketball scrimmages give students the chance to practice three-point shots and dunks. Older students share tips and moves with incoming sixth graders.

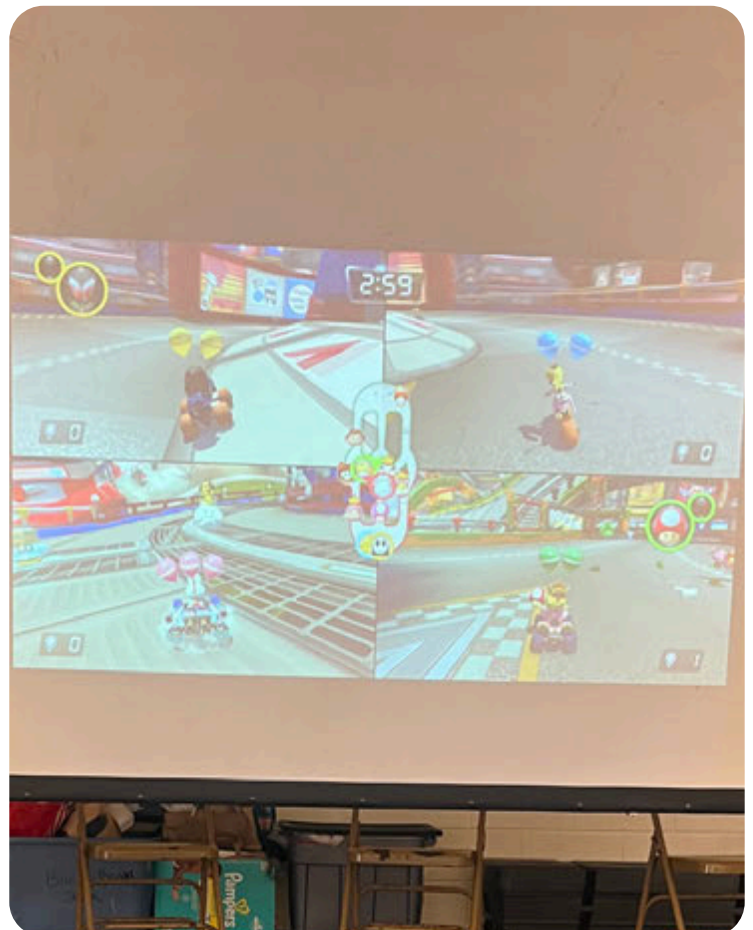
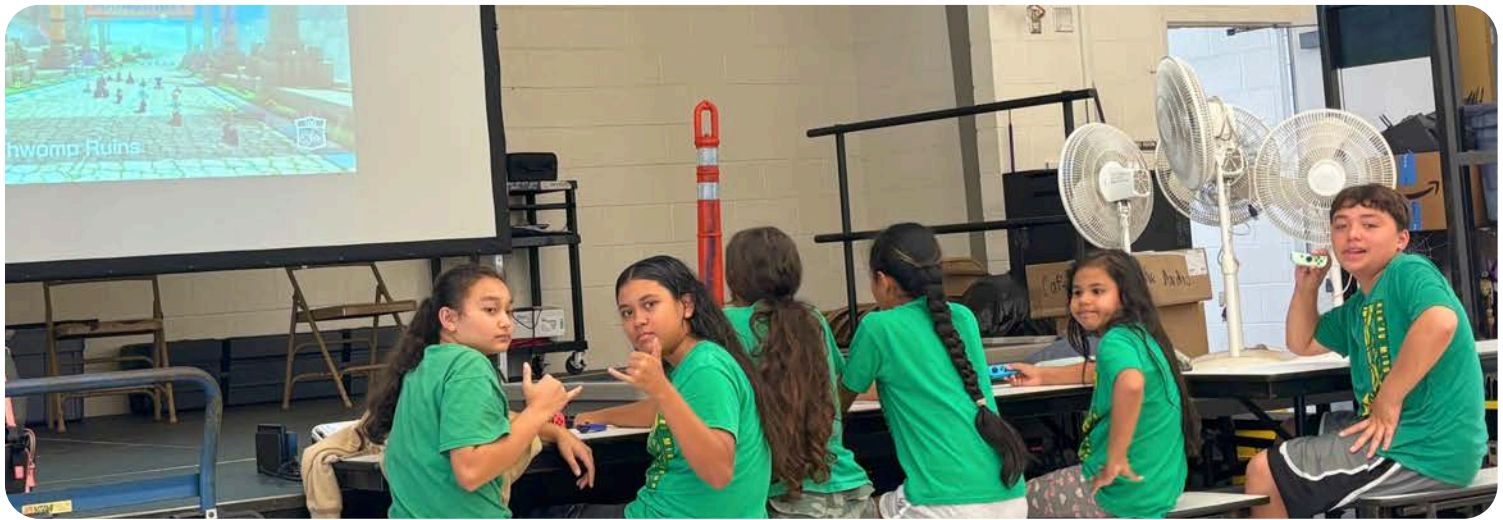


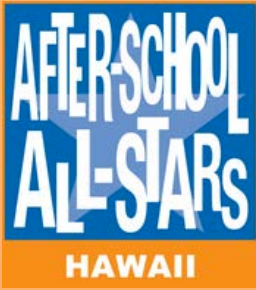


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E-SPORTS

In e-sports, students compete in Mario Kart, learning collaboration, communication, and strategy as they work to avoid opposing drivers and protect their balloons.





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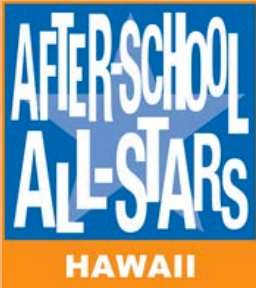
TEAM BUILDING

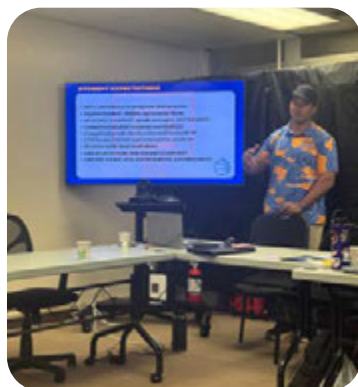
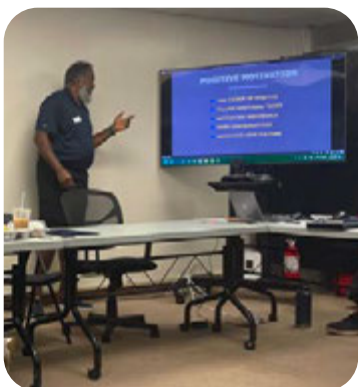


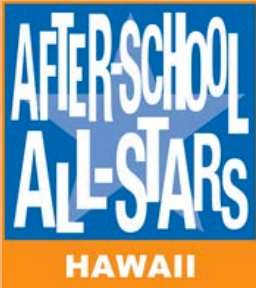


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SC RETREAT - DAY TWO

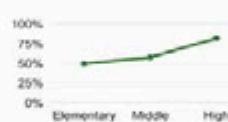
