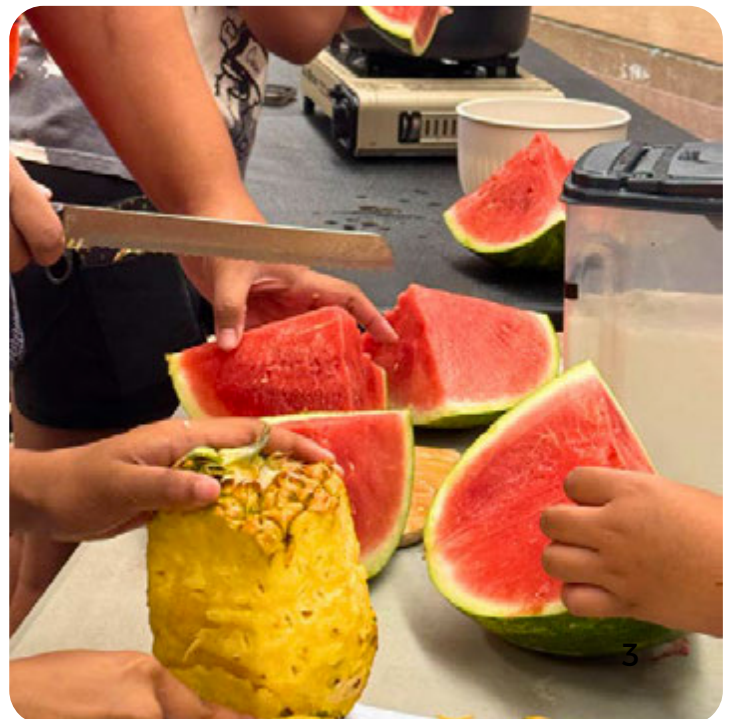




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PASIFIKA

In preparation for the new school year, After-School All-Stars Site Coordinators and Program Team had fun working together in various team bonding activities and ipu-making.

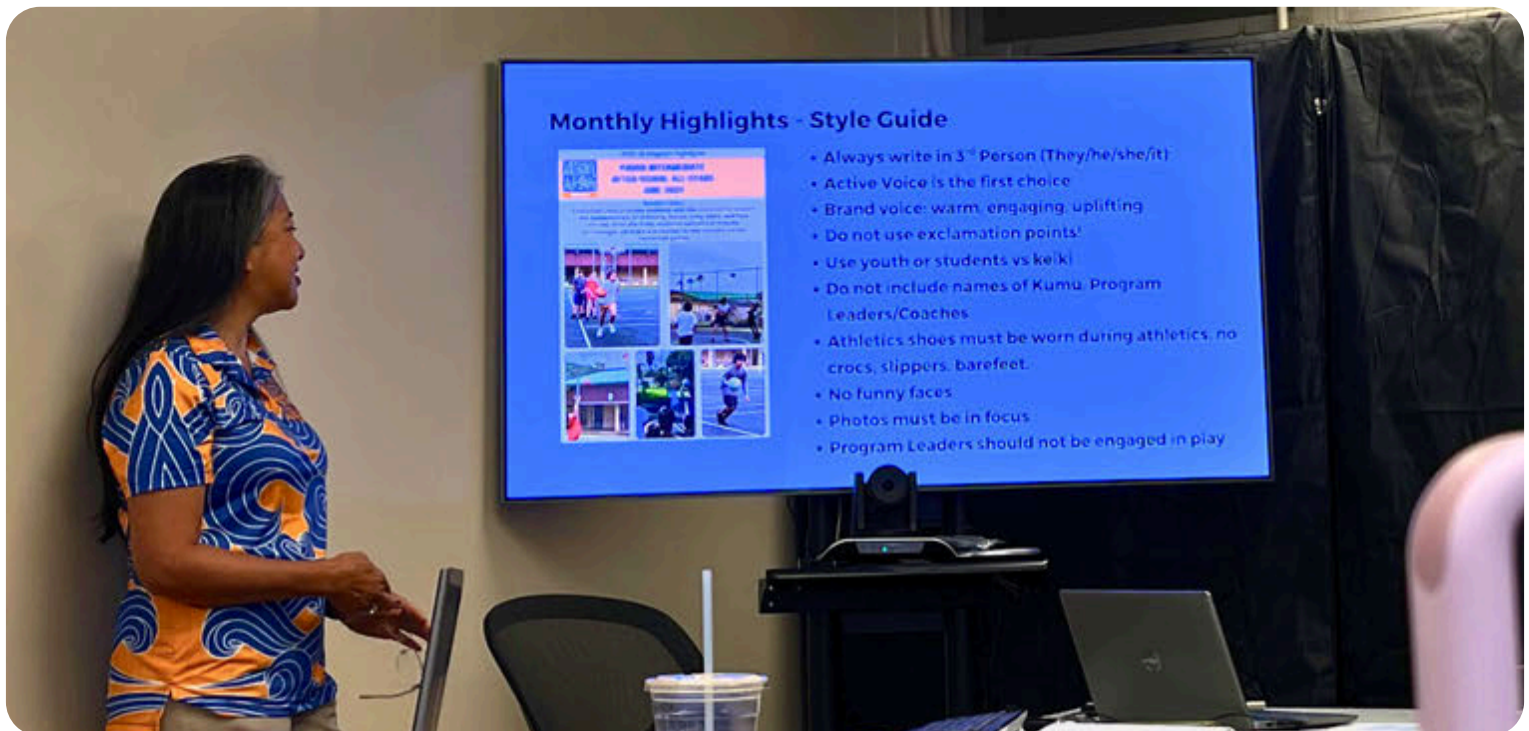




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STAFF RETREAT DAY TWO

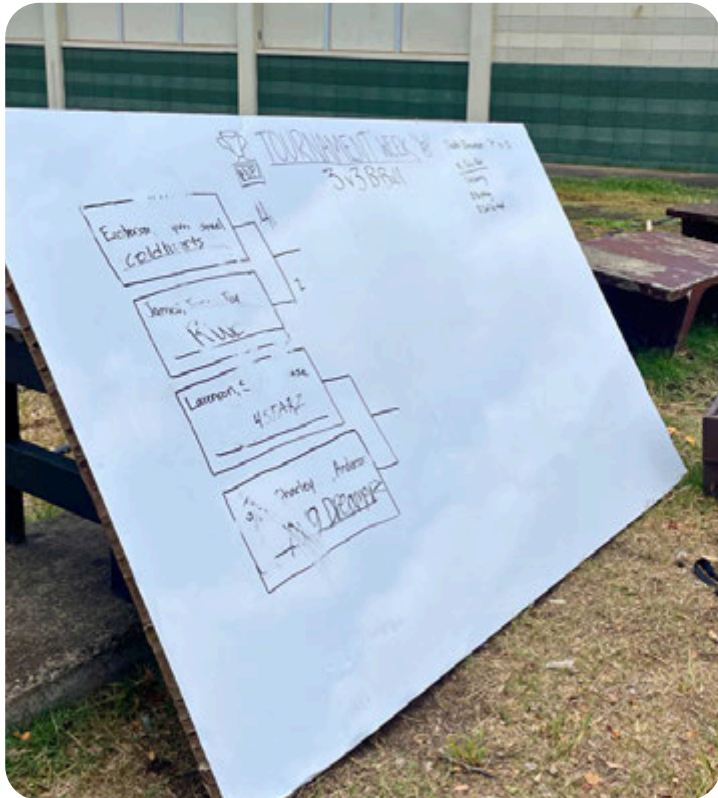


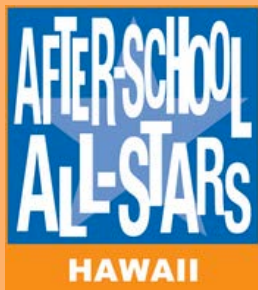


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BASKETBALL

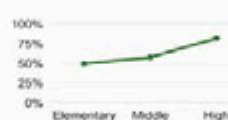
