Students had a blast experimenting with different ingredients to create chemical reactions and make slime, sparking curiosity and excitement for science.








Daily ice-breaker activities energized students and set a positive tone for the day. They enjoyed dancing and participating in a card relay race.





In Football class, students practiced their throwing and passing skills by playing fun games.






BACK-TO-SCHOOL BASH

Visitors at the ASAS Hawaii table enjoyed sweet treats, and new participants who signed up received some cool swag.





Site Coordinators from O'ahu and Hawai'i Island gathered for a fun team-building day that emphasized collaboration and problem-solving.








