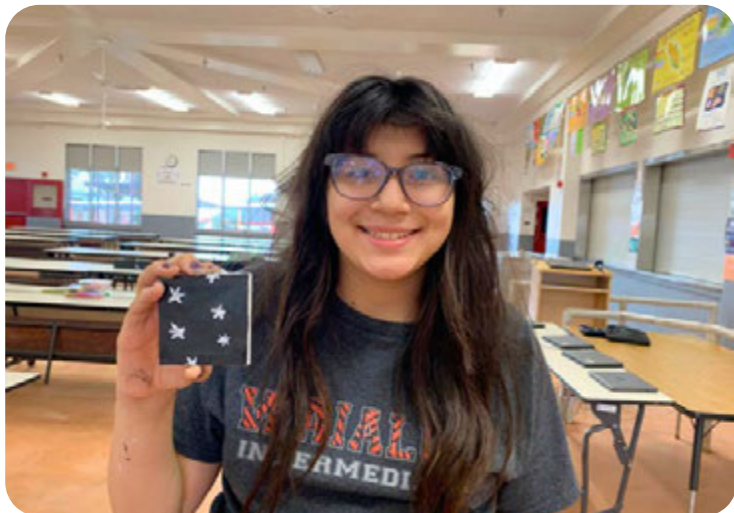

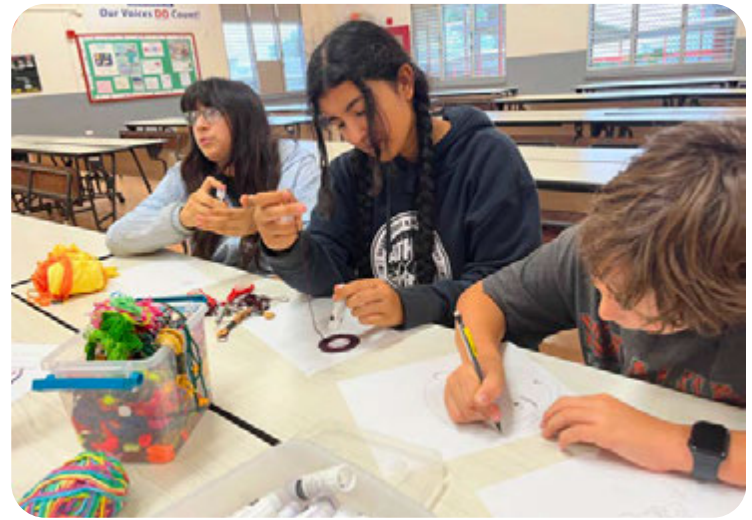




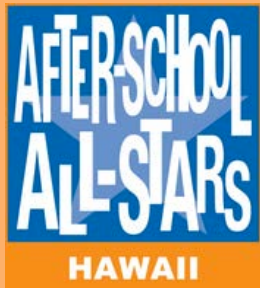
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### ARTS AND CRAFTS: YARN ART

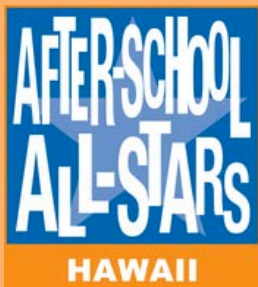
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### COOKING: CHOPPED

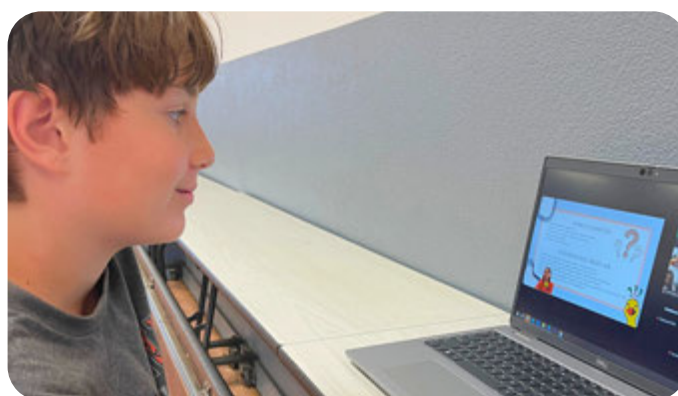




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## QUARTER TWO YOUTH ADVISORY BOARD MEETING
