


# WASHINGTON MIDDLE AFTER-SCHOOL ALL-STARS FEBRUARY 2026





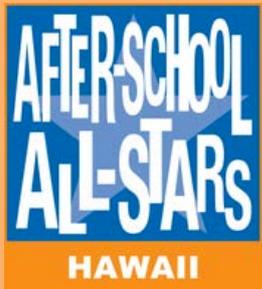


# WASHINGTON MIDDLE AFTER-SCHOOL ALL-STARS FEBRUARY 2026

Students plan their week using a weekly time schedule. Learning and practicing time management helps students understand how to use time to their advantage.






# WASHINGTON MIDDLE AFTER-SCHOOL ALL-STARS FEBRUARY 2026

Students were challenged to bring a friend on Friday in hopes to share what happens in program and a sweet treat with them. These activities create bonds and memories with classmates.






# WASHINGTON MIDDLE AFTER-SCHOOL ALL-STARS FEBRUARY 2026

Soccer class students learn passing and dribbling skills, honing them to become better athletes by improving their agility and ball control.






# WASHINGTON MIDDLE AFTER-SCHOOL ALL-STARS FEBRUARY 2026

Volleyball students practice serving the volleyball over the net to their peers on the other side. This activity helps students develop their strength, precision and perseverance.



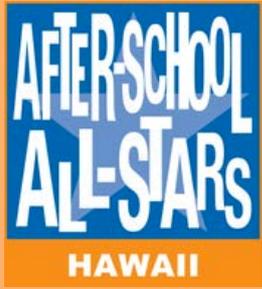


# WASHINGTON MIDDLE AFTER-SCHOOL ALL-STARS FEBRUARY 2026

Students enjoy a playful scrimmage, putting into action the skills they practice in every class. Each opportunity to play helps build confidence and strengthen their overall game.






# WASHINGTON MIDDLE AFTER-SCHOOL ALL-STARS FEBRUARY 2026

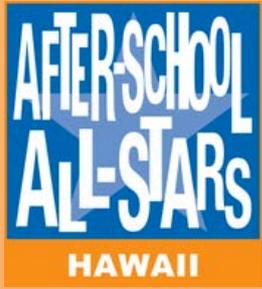


# WASHINGTON MIDDLE AFTER-SCHOOL ALL-STARS FEBRUARY 2026




