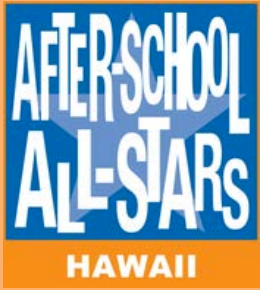


# WASHINGTON MIDDLE AFTER-SCHOOL ALL-STARS APRIL 2026

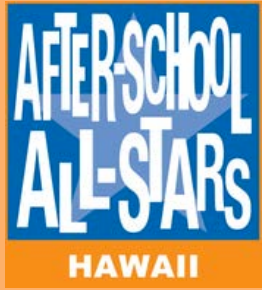
# WASHINGTON MIDDLE AFTER-SCHOOL ALL-STARS APRIL 2026

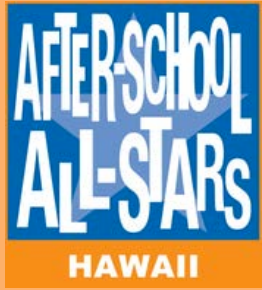

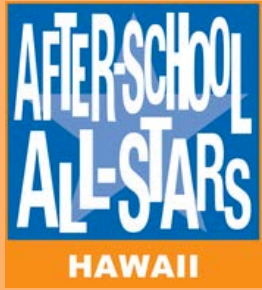


## WASHINGTON MIDDLE AFTER-SCHOOL ALL-STARS APRIL 2026

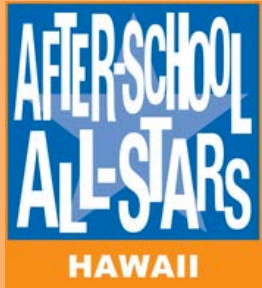

These hands-on experiences strengthen life skills while encouraging healthy habits and creativity.

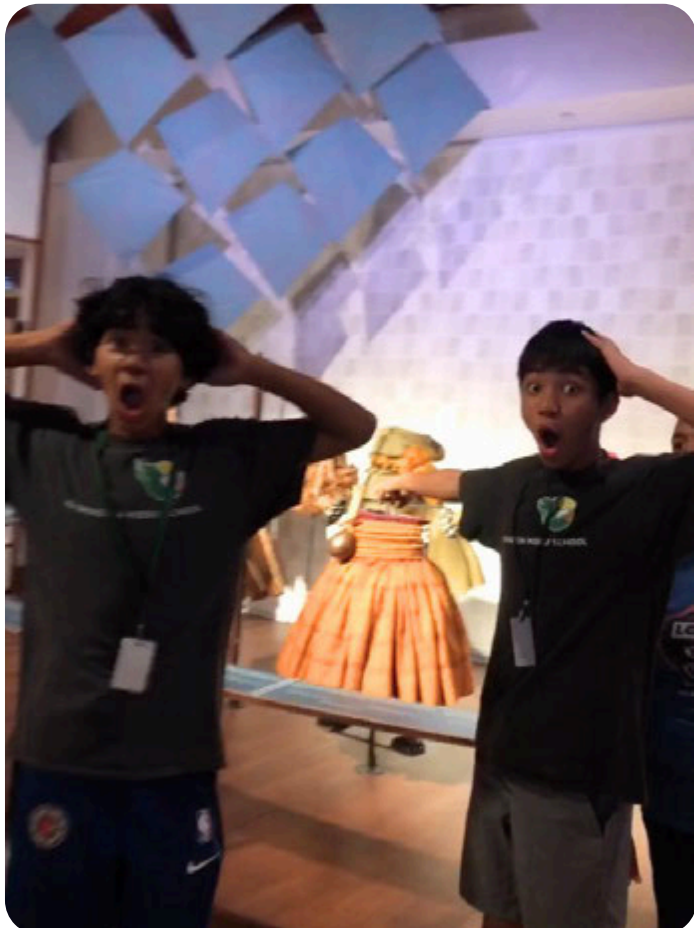


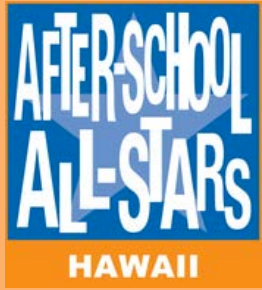


# WASHINGTON MIDDLE AFTER-SCHOOL ALL-STARS APRIL 2026

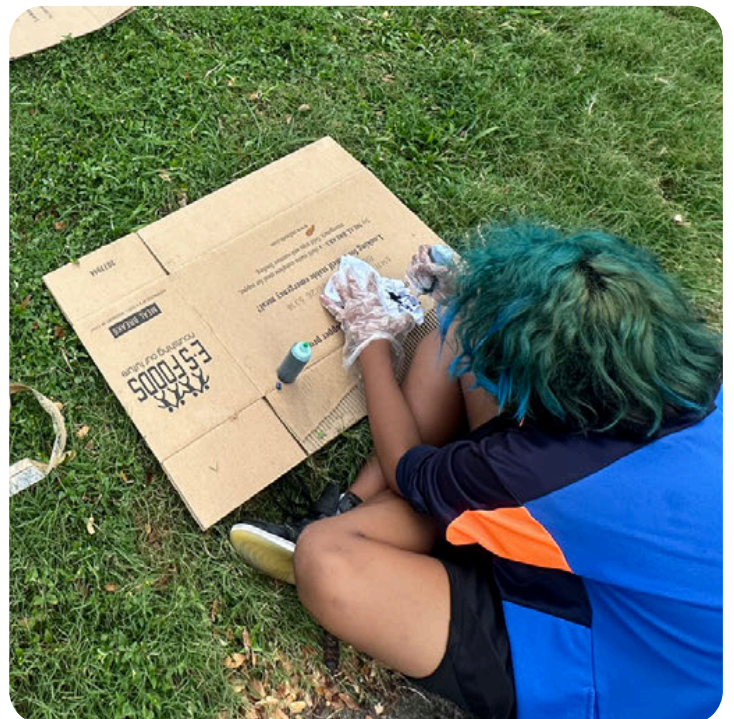


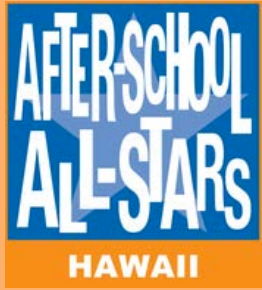


# WASHINGTON MIDDLE AFTER-SCHOOL ALL-STARS APRIL 2026

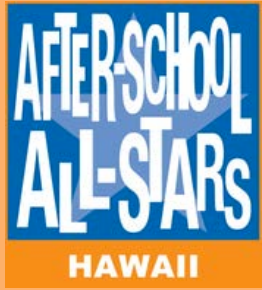


## WASHINGTON MIDDLE AFTER-SCHOOL ALL-STARS APRIL 2026
